CPC is excited to report back on how we've been working on sustainability measures for this year's conference and beyond! As we return to in-person meetings, we want to ensure we minimize our impact on the environment.

This year's paper name badge inserts are made from 100% post consumer recycled material. We are also using the last of the plastic badge holders from our conference materials stock; we will be switching to a new company moving forward who creates badge holders from a [patented biodegradable and compostable material](#). Attendees are encouraged to keep and reuse their badge holders from this year's conference; they are coincidentally the perfect size for holding vaccination cards and keeping them safe!

The new ribbons ordered this year are also biodegradable and compostable; as we need to print additional ribbons in the future, we will switch to this material.

Sustainability at Baltimore Marriott Waterfront

Environmental sustainability is important at Baltimore Marriott Waterfront. The hotel makes an effort to implement eco-friendly facilities and practices whenever possible: conferences and business events at our hotel feature single-stream recycling, food-composting programs, and pens and notepads made from recycled materials. The hotel uses LED lighting throughout the building, and guest rooms feature low flow showerheads and toilets to conserve water.

The hotel restaurant, Apropoe's, offers food using sustainable ingredients from local farms to craft seasonal comfort dishes inspired by Baltimore tradition.
