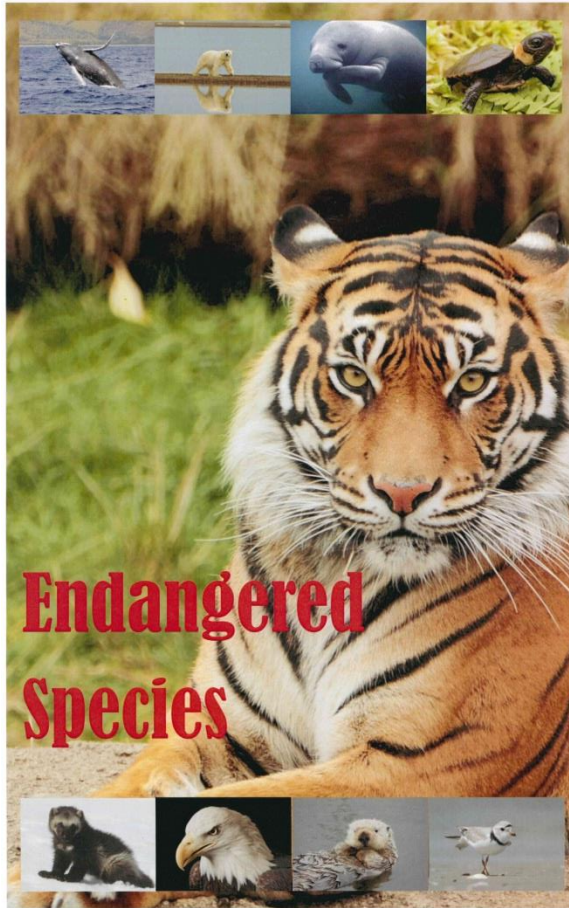

Endangered Species Day:

May 16th

There are over 3,000 species of animals worldwide that are in danger of becoming extinct. Endangered Species Day, created in 2006 by Congress, creates an opportunity to learn about the importance of protecting endangered species and actions individuals can take to help. These animals are endangered due to things like loss of habitat and spread of invasive species.

Congress passed the Endangered Species Act in 1973 which makes it unlawful for anyone to harm, endanger, or "take" a member of a listed species. This includes acts that may indirectly harm the species by damaging critical habitat or impacting other species that are vital to the listed species' survival. The ESA also creates plans for the recovery of these species and provides resources to aid the conservation efforts of landowners, tribes, and state agencies.
