CLEMSON--Billy Wingo batted in four runs with a bases-loaded double and a single here Monday afternoon to lead Clemson to a 10 to 1 victory over High Point College for the Tigers' third straight victory of the year. The same two teams will meet again here ~~Tuesday~~ <sup>WEDNESDAY</sup> afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Ron Musselman hurled six innings of one-hit ball to record his first decision of the year. He gave up an infield hit to third baseman Paul Walter in the fourth and allowed only one other base runner on a walk while striking out seven. Houston Matthews hurled the final three frames and fell victim to two more Walter hits, who had three of the four Panther safeties. A single, two walks and a double play cost a shutout in the seventh.

Clemson sent 13 men to the plate in the fourth, collected seven hits and took advantage of three walks and two wild pitches. Steve Nilsson collected one of his two doubles during the uprising.

Four walks and a wild pitch staked the Tigers to another run in the fifth and they added another pair in the eighth on a walk, a triple by Pete Peltz and Wingo's single. Clemson had on base in every inning.

Dirk Gurley, the first of four Panther pitchers, was charged with the loss.

Nilsson, Neil Simons, Bill Foley and Wingo all had a pair of hits for Tigers, who took advantage of 12 walks given up by the four High Point hurlers.

CLEMSON--Righthander Tommy Qualters hurled a three-hit shutout here Wednesday afternoon as Clemson won its ninth straight game by a score of 3-0 over Mercer. The loss was the first for the Bears, who entered the game with a 6-0 mark.

Qualters went the distance for the first time this season to record his second decision without a loss. He struck out 11 Mercer batters and walked only one. He gave us a one-out and a two-out single in the second, but caught catcher Carl Discher looking at a third strike to end the threat.

The Somerset, Pa., junior allowed only three base runners after that--a walk in the third, his final hit in the sixth and a hit batsman in the seventh. But he retired the last eight batters to face him.

The Tigers scored in the first as Steve Nilsson walked, went to second as Neil Simons popped out to the catcher, stole third and came home as Dave Caldwell hit a line smash which the Mercer first baseman could not handle.

Clemson added two more runs in the second on a double by Bill Schroeder, a single by Simons and two walks, one of which came to Caldwell with the bases loaded.

Mercer pitcher Jim Rollins lost his first decision after two wins and at one time, retired seven Tigers in a row. He did not give up a hit after the third inning and allowed only two base runners after that, both on walks. He struck out five and walked a like number. One of his walks was cut down stealing and the other came after two were out. Schroeder had two of Clemson's four hits, one of them a double.

The two teams meet again here Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock.

Jacket catcher Bobby Jackson led off the ninth with his third hit and was sacrificed to second. Jackson held as Jucky Burns, also with a three-hit performance, grounded out. Rich Robbins then drove Weems to deep centerfield where the freshman made a leaping, falling catch for the third out. It was his seven putout of the afternoon.

Pete Peltz hit a two-run homer for the Tigers in the second. The three round trippers by the Tigers were the first ones since playing Lewis seven games back.
