# ***Press, Radio and TV***

If you're assigned to cover a game in Clemson's Memorial Stadium this fall, the following hints will be helpful:

## **ENTRANCE TO STADIUM/PRESS BOX**

Enter through Gate 14 which is located on the press box (South) side of the field at the southeast corner. Should you have need to pick up tickets at our press will call gate, they will be at Gate 14. Come through Gate 14, turn right, and go straight to the elevator which will take you to the press box.

## **PRESS BOX**

There are two levels to Clemson's new press box, located in the center of the club level of the South stands. The first level contains the photo deck, the outside PA, stadium operations & security, along with booths for field telephones, radio, networks and athletic directors for Clemson and the visiting team. The second level will be for the print media, with seating accommodations for 100 members of the working press. This level will also house Clemson's famous buffet, and the telecopier room. There is a dark room on the photo level.

## **WORKING CREDENTIALS**

We'll appreciate getting these as early as you know your assignment. Requests for working press and photo passes are honored from SPORTS EDITORS of DAILY newspapers and RADIO & TV SPORTS DIRECTORS **ONLY**. Make request directly to BOB BRADLEY, preferably a week in advance of kickoff to insure adequate mailing time. Spouses, dates, non-workers, and anyone 16 years of age or younger, are not permitted in the press box.

## **PARKING PASSES AND COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS**

There are a limited number of these available for use by the members of the working press, and the sooner we know of your need, the closer we will come to filling your request. Your request should be made directly to BOB BRADLEY.

## **TELECOPIER AND WESTERN UNION SERVICES**

Our press box is equipped with eight (8) outside lines and outlets for your telecopiers, and at no charge to your paper. We will have three telecopiers at the game which can be used on a first-come, first-serve basis, and we also have **press box** assistants who are available to send your copy as necessary. **THERE IS NO CHARGE FOR ANY OF THESE SERVICES.** It is the responsibility of each writer to make prior arrangements with Western Union for that company's service. Electrical and telephone outlets are at each seat for other equipment.

We furnish a typed play-by-play, individual and team stats, and coaches' quotes. Also, our communications center staff furnishes a packet of first half action shots — six 8 x 10 black and white prints.

## **LOCKER ROOM INTERVIEWS**

Bob Bradley will escort those writers wishing to go to the Clemson dressing room, whereas the visiting SID will make the trip to the opponent's dressing area. This usually takes place with about three minutes showing on the scoreboard clock. The dressing rooms are located beneath the West end zone stands, opposite the scoreboard end of the field.

## FALL PRACTICE PLANS

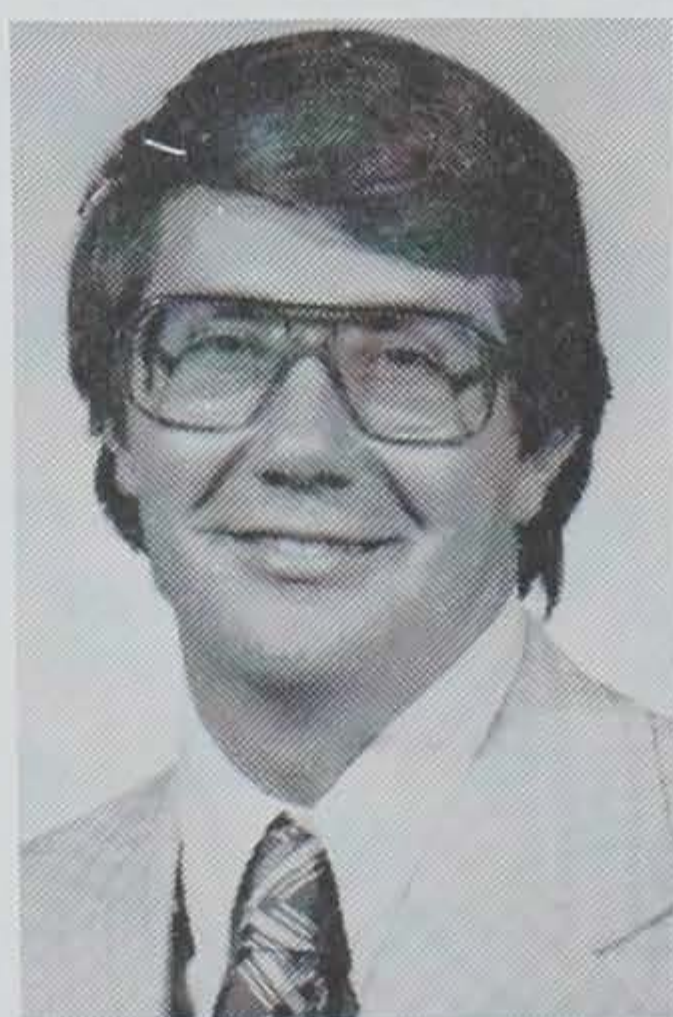

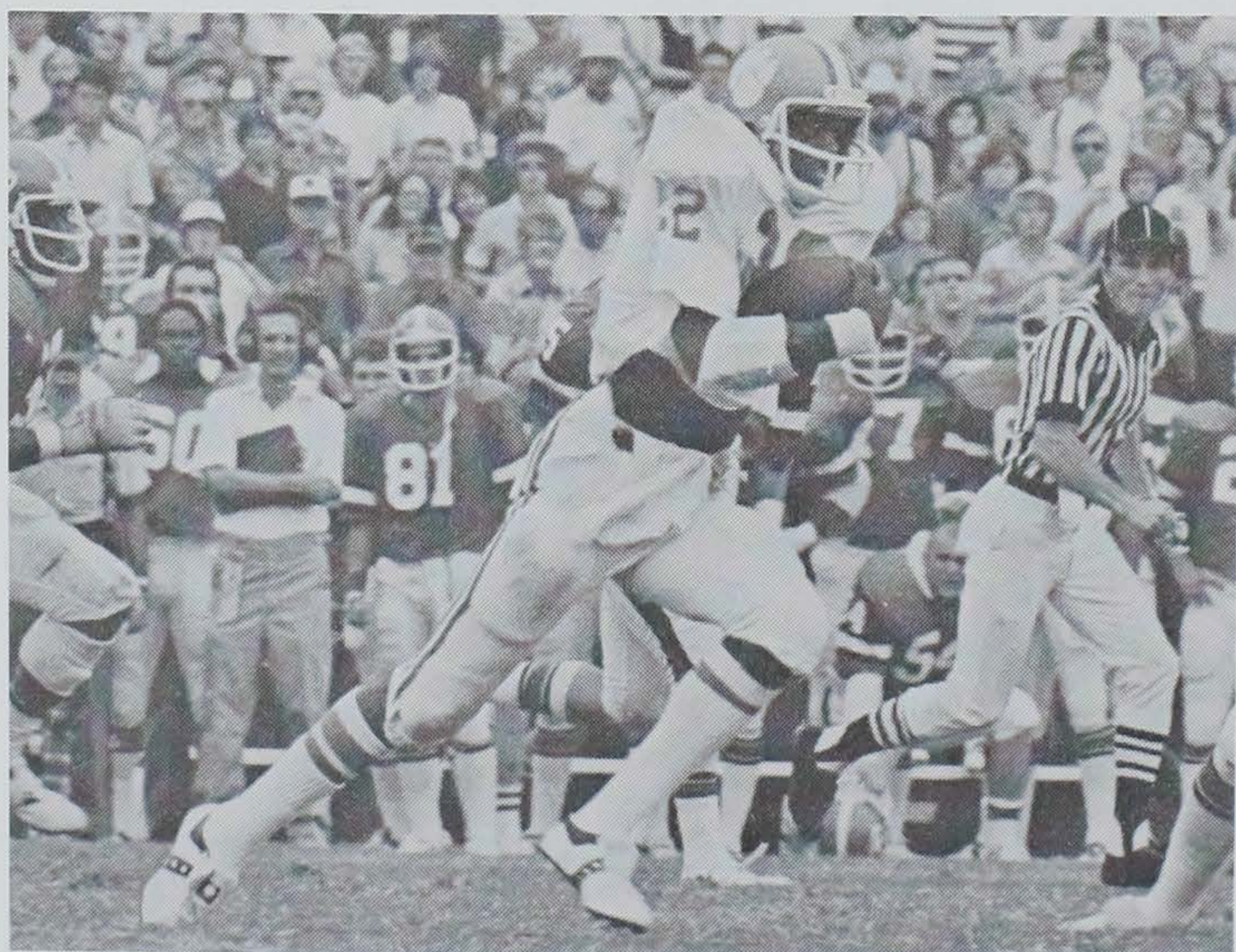
# TIGERS LOOK TO EXTEND NATION'S LONGEST WINNING STREAK

Clemson football coach Danny Ford conquered all kinds of adversity when he guided the Tigers to a 17-15 Gator Bowl victory over Ohio State in his first game as a head coach. But the problems of taking over a team at the end of the season for one of the most important games in Clemson history might seem miniscule in comparison to what lies ahead for the 31-year-old head coach.

Gone from last year's 11-1, sixth-ranked team are 15 starters, seven of whom made first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference. And among that corps were Clemson's all-time leading passer and total offense leader, Steve Fuller, the Tigers' all-time leading receiver, first-round draft choice Jerry Butler, and two-time All-America offensive guard Joe Bostic. It is obvious to Clemson partisans and Ford himself, that the Tiger mentor will have his work cut out for him in 1979 if he hopes to significantly build on Clemson's 10-game winning streak, the longest victory skein in the country.

"This team certainly has the ability to be a conference champion and make an impact on the national scene," said Ford. "We accomplished a lot in the spring, setting a good foundation for the fall but the drills prior to the season opener with Furman will be very important. During those practices we will see how much our squad worked during the summer. I always have believed that the great seasons are made in the off-season workouts when a player builds his stamina and strength for the coming season.

"We did not reach all of our goals in the spring and we certainly have room for improvement, but if everyone comes back for fall practice healthy and the freshmen contribute quickly we'll win our share of games. I won't make a prediction as to how many games we will win, but I know we won't be afraid to line up against anybody."

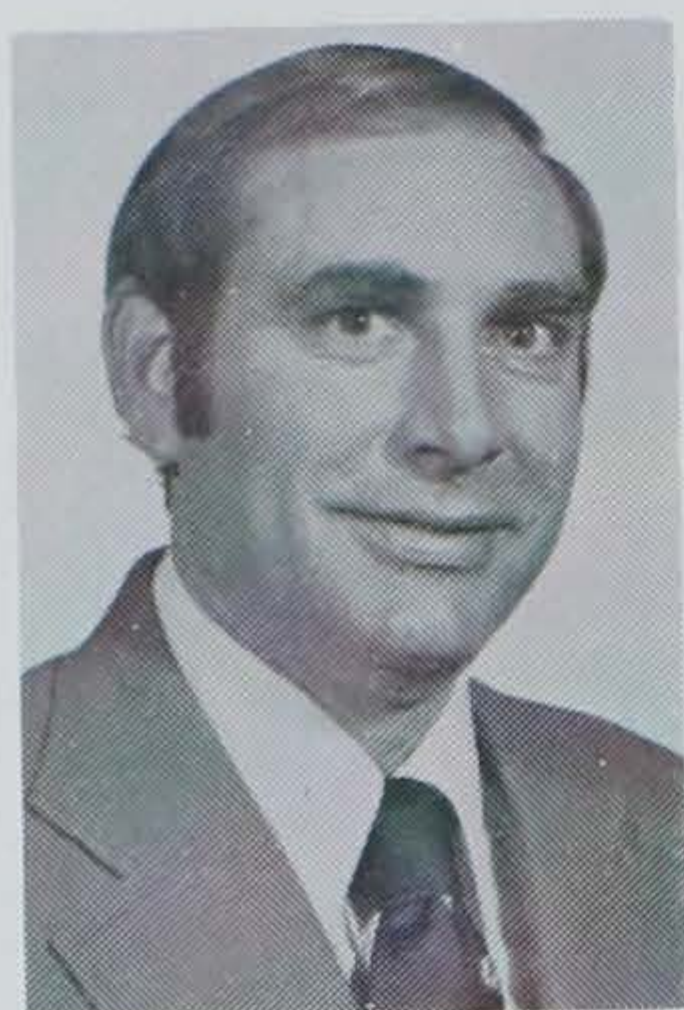

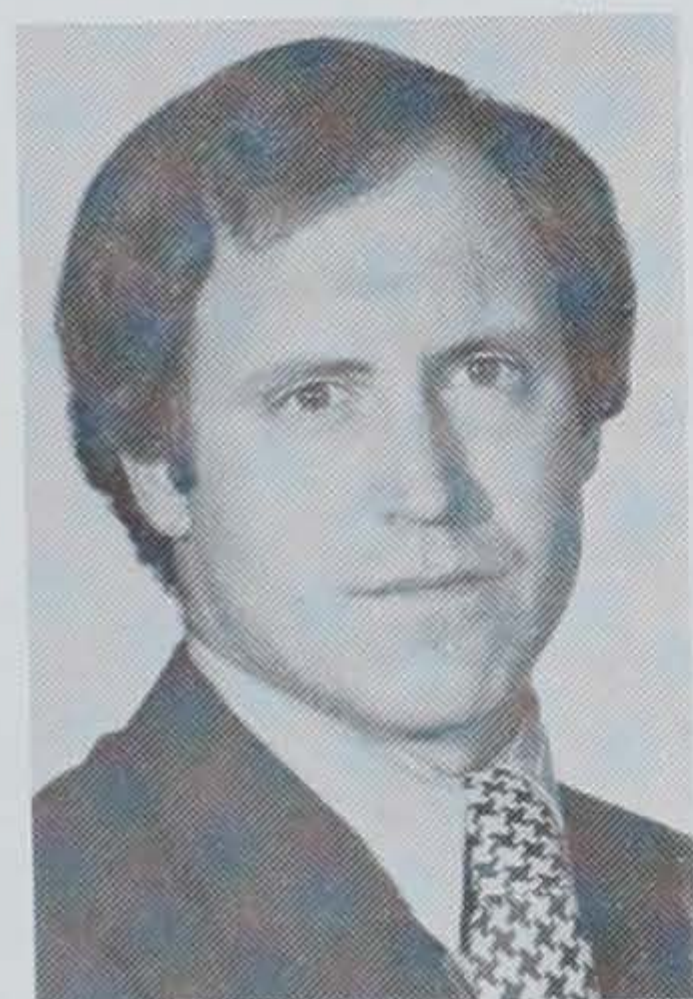

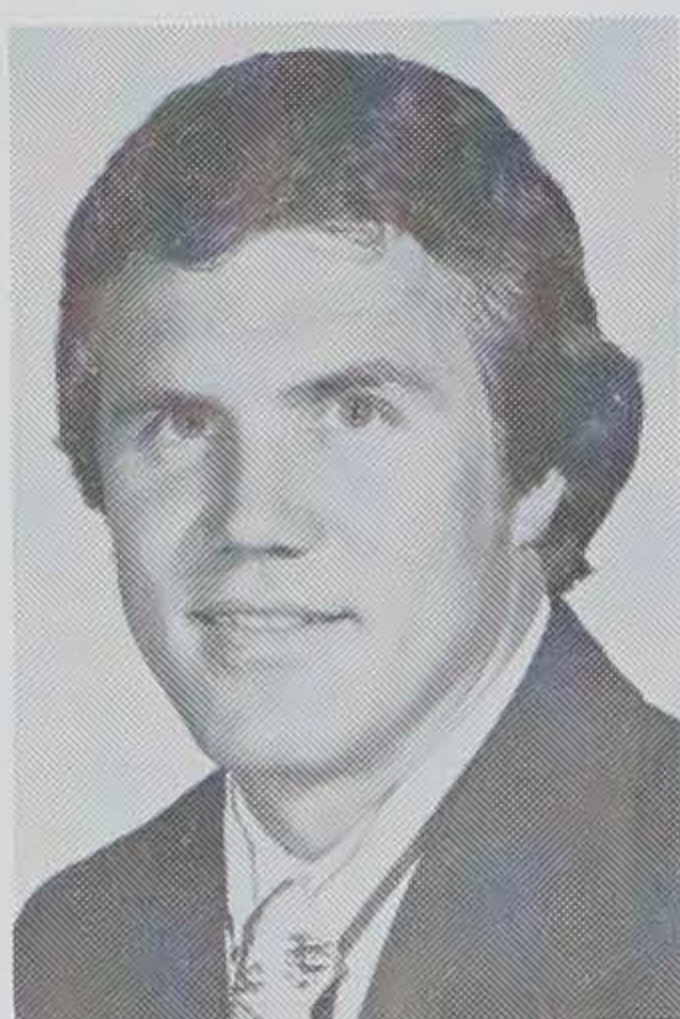

## CLEMSON MEMORIAL STADIUM

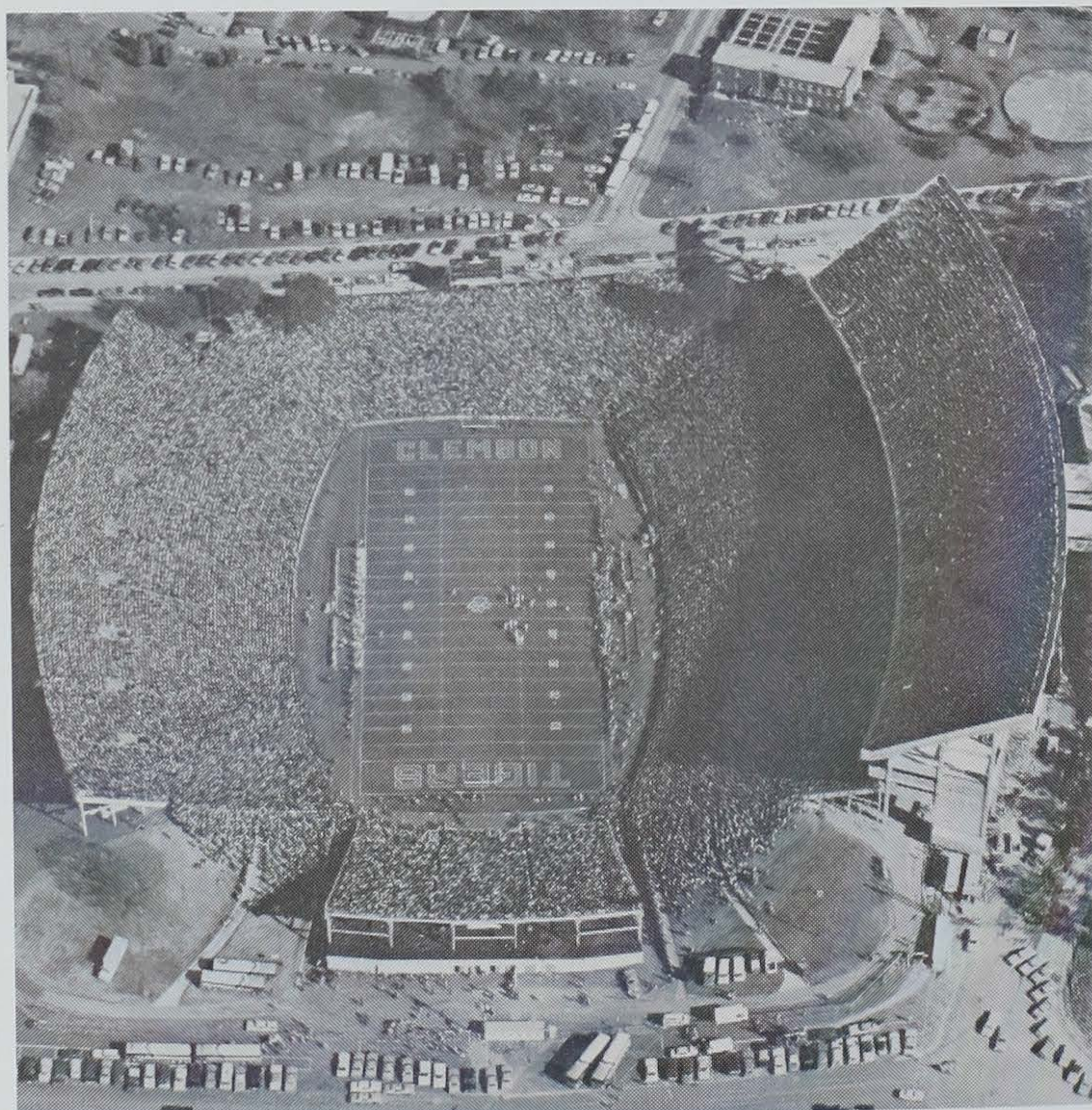
For the past several years, the old problem of supply and demand has been causing headaches for the Clemson ticket office. With ticket demands going through the roof and only a limited amount of seats, something had to be done. The answer was the new upper deck for Clemson's Memorial Stadium.

After two years of work, and eight million dollars of capital investment, the new addition was finished. The upper deck, which will make "Death Valley" look even more ominous to visiting opponents, will seat an additional 9,855 Tiger faithful. The new structure brings the total permanent seating capacity of Memorial Stadium to 53,306.

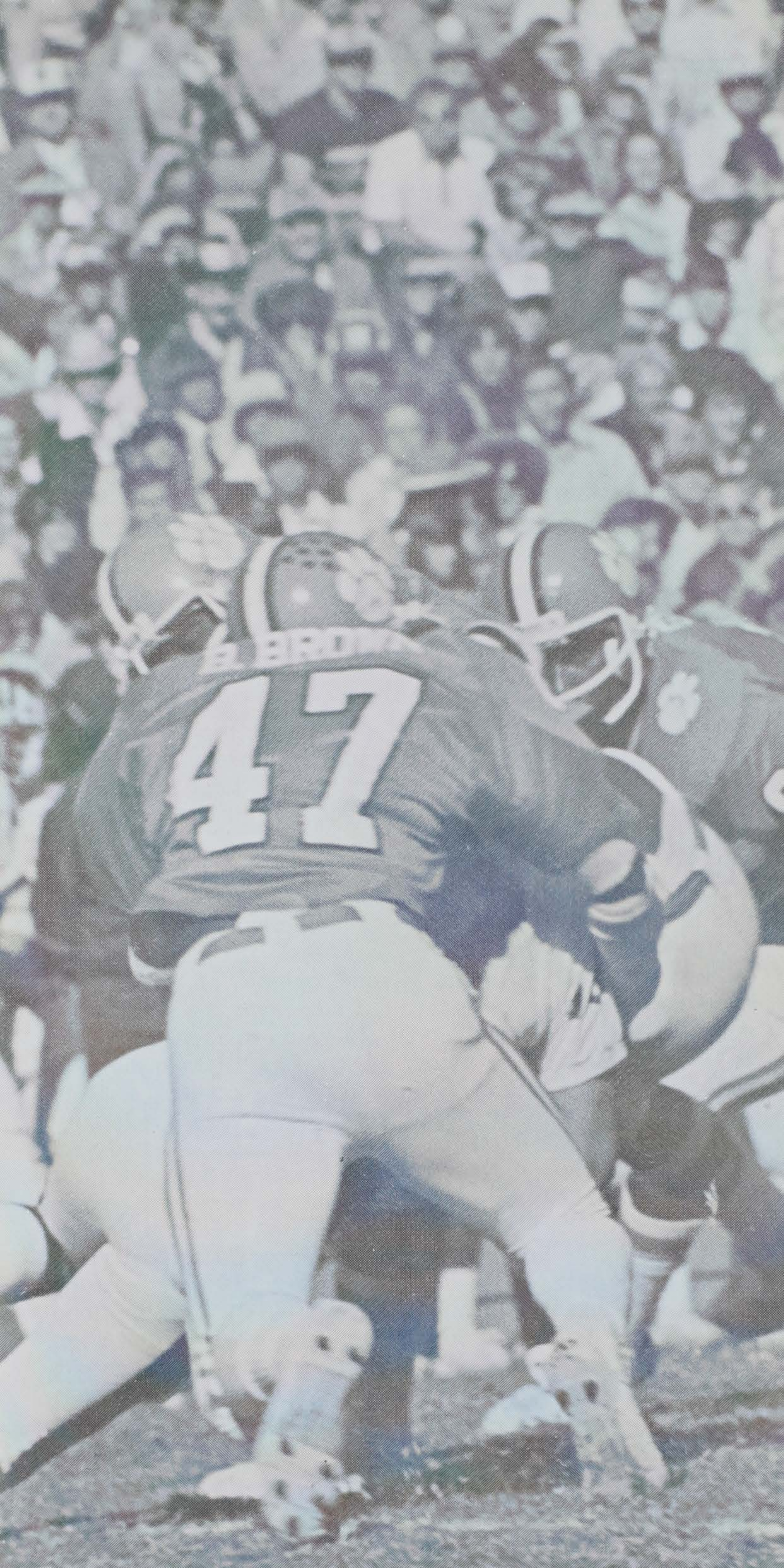
The new seats were first used in Clemson's 1978 season finale against arch-rival South Carolina when the Tigers downed the Gamecocks 41-23. Every possible seat was jammed with fans as the addition helped set a new Clemson attendance record of 63,050.

Also completed was a new section for handicapped fans. This facility is located between the South stands and the West endzone stands.

The final new structure in "Death Valley" is the press box. The new press facility is located between the upper deck and the old stands on the south side of the stadium. It is glass enclosed and fully carpeted with a special area for photographers and filming crews. There are seats for 100 writers, giving Clemson one of the most spacious press areas in the South.





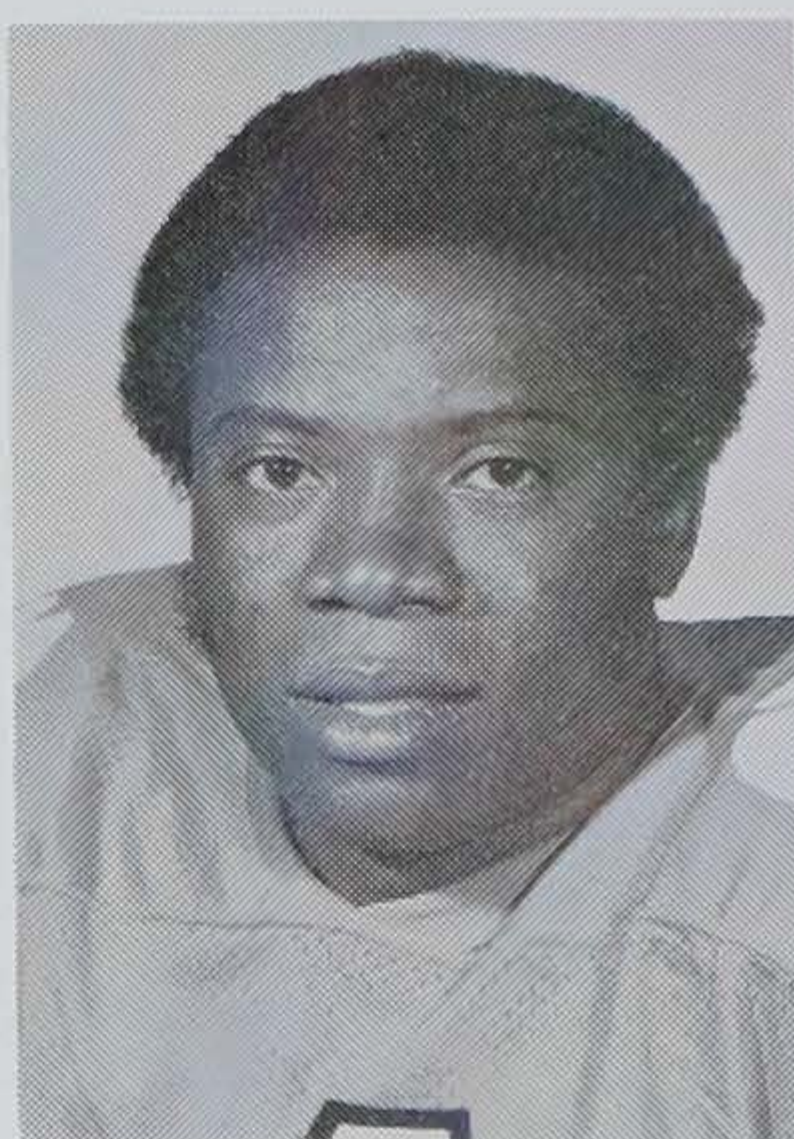
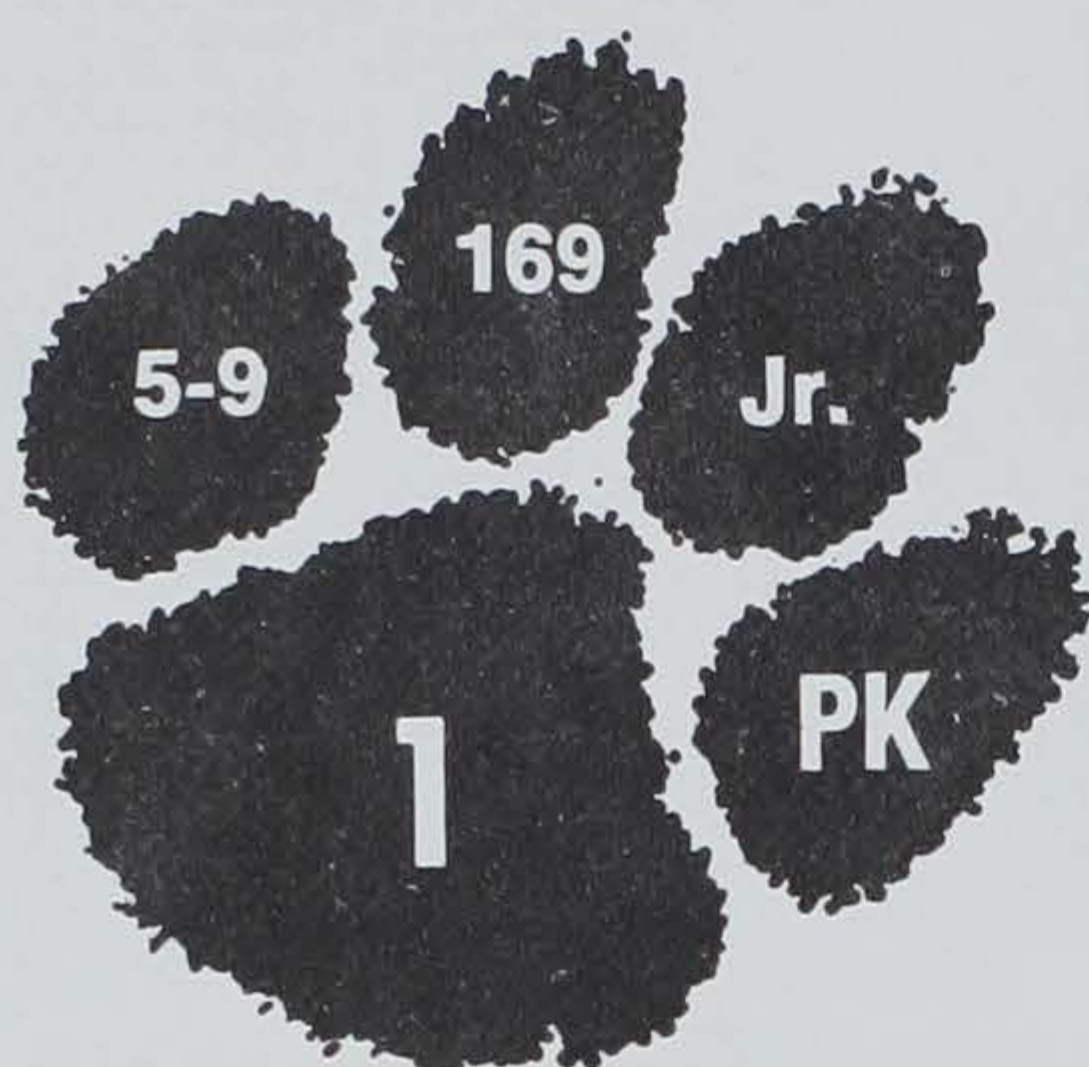

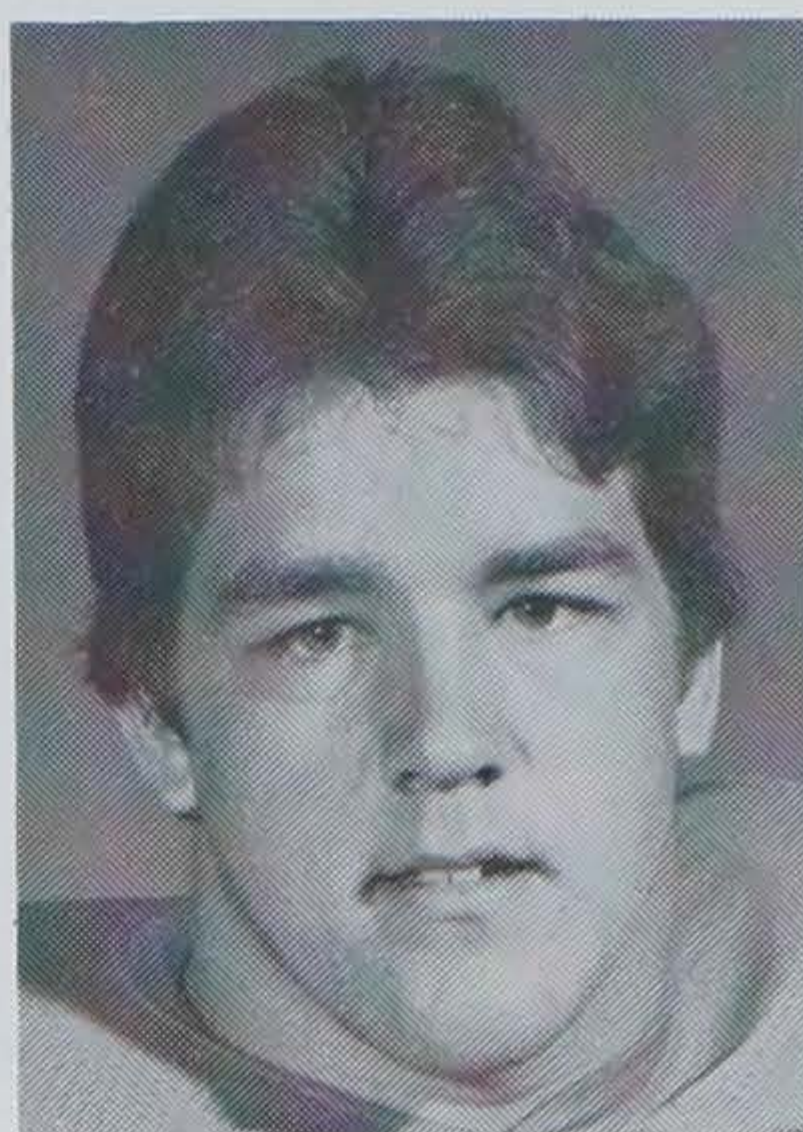
For someone who had not played a game of football before 1977, he has made quite an impact on the game at Clemson . . . with two full seasons of eligibility remaining he is already Clemson's all-time kick-scoring leader with 139 points . . . second on the all-time list in PATs and field goals . . . needs only six more extra points and only seven more field goals to become Clemson's all-time leader in those categories . . . scored 86 points last year, the third best total in Clemson history . . . set season conference records for PATs and field goals last year with 44 and 14, respectively . . . set the single season mark for kick scoring with 86 points, breaking his own mark of 53 set during the 1977 campaign . . . 12th in the nation in scoring last year . . . holds the school record for field goals in a game (four vs. Wake Forest, 1977) and for the longest field goal (57 yards in same game) . . . that 57-yard effort tied a conference record . . . also owns the Gator Bowl mark for the longest field goal, 49 yards against Pittsburgh in 1977 . . . booted a 47-yarder against Ohio State in the 1978 Gator Bowl . . . kicked five points in the contest, a 17-15 Clemson win . . . hit on 14-25 field goals in 1978, the longest was a 49-yard effort against South Carolina . . . had four games in 1978 in which he kicked at least two field goals . . . his best effort was a three field goal performance against Wake Forest (37,24 and 33 yards) . . . the Deacons are his favorite team, he has booted seven field goals against Wake Forest in the last two seasons . . . enters 1978 with a string of 20 consecutive extra points . . . started 1977 as the long range kicker, but in the fourth game, he inherited the short duty as well . . . second on the team in scoring that year with 53 points . . . a very accurate kicker inside the forty, he has connected on 17 of 21 attempts inside that mark in his career . . . came to Clemson on a soccer scholarship . . . played soccer for I. M. Ibrahim's team in 1976 . . . he was the third leading scorer with 15 goals on a team that advanced to the final four of the NCAA tournament . . . came out of retirement last fall to play in the semifinals of the NCAA soccer tournament . . . born 4/7/56 in Owerri, Nigeria . . . majoring in industrial management.

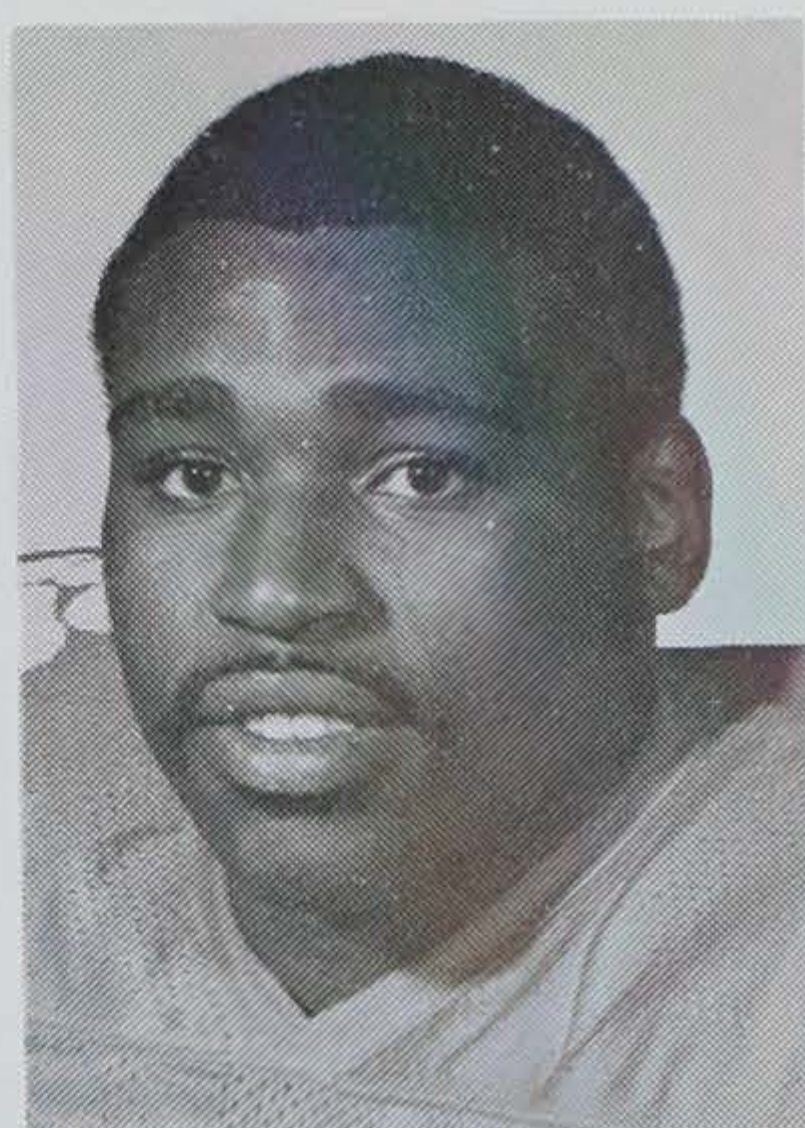
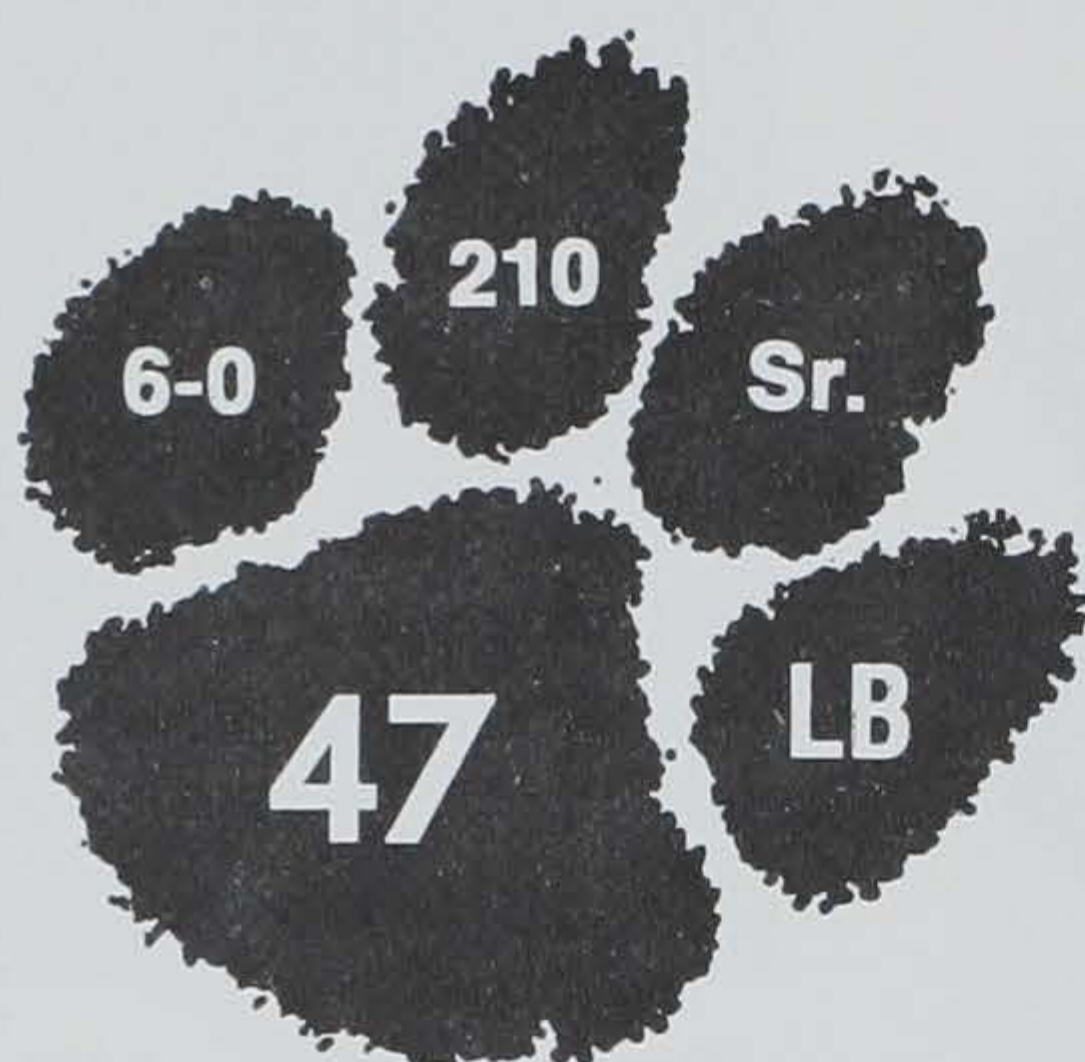


**Greensboro, NC**

Started his career at Clemson as "Joe's little brother", but he has established himself as one of the best offensive linemen in the Atlantic Coast Conference . . . brother Joe Bostic was an All-American his last two years at Clemson at an offensive guard slot and was drafted last spring by the St. Louis Cardinals . . . Like Clemson, most of Maryland's firepower on offense in 1978 was generated by seniors. Gone are Steve Atkins and Tim O'Hare, two of the best backs in the league. Overall, Maryland gained 3,676 yards in total offense last year. Returning players for 1979 accounted for only 384 yards, or just over 10 percent of the Terrapin offense.

Offensively, the Terrapins might go to the passing game a little more. Mike Tice, a 6-7 quarterback, completed 54 percent of his passes in spot duty last year. His prime target this season will be Eric Sievers, a 6-4 tight end. He grabbed 21 passes last fall and has lettered three times. George Scott, a

burly back who lettered on the 1977 Terp team, but missed 1978 because of injury, should be back to aid the running attack.

The Terrapin defense lost only four starters, but All-ACC tackle Charles Johnson was one of them. Joe Muffler and Bruce Palmer are two defensive linemen who will have to fill Johnson's shoes.

The top defensive player, however, is in the secondary. Senior Lloyd Burruss is a three-year starter who is Maryland's big play man. He had 71 tackles from the secondary, an exceptionally large amount, in 1978, caused three fumbles, intercepted three passes and blocked two kicks.

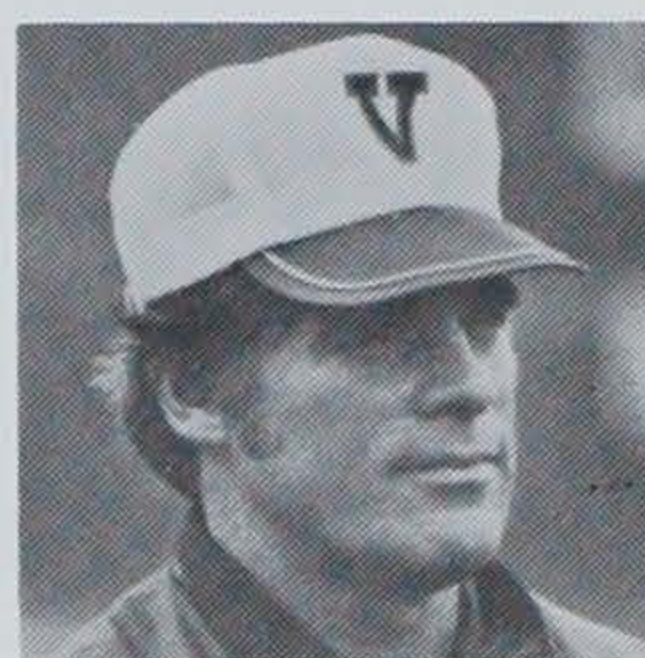

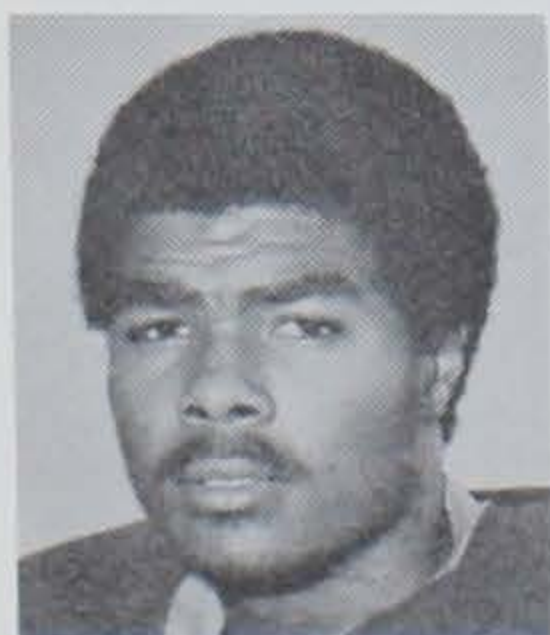

A new coaching era in Duke football begins this year as Red Wilson takes over as head coach of the Blue Devils. Wilson served as head coach at Elon College for 10 years where he led his team to a 72-34-2 ledger. He took Elon to the national NAIA finals twice and had another team that was ranked third in the NAIA. In that campaign he was named NAIA national coach-of-the-year. Last year, he did not coach, but served as an assistant athletic director at Duke. So he is familiar with his new team.

Ned Gonet is one of Wilson's top players. Gonet was the team's second leading rusher in 1978 with 362 yards. But this year the fine all-around athlete will switch to defense and start at linebacker. He and Eric Drescher will anchor the second line of defense, while co-captain Craig Hoskins will be the top defensive back.

On offense, Bob Riordan, the other co-captain, leads the offensive line that returns four starters. They will open holes for Duke's new split-veer offense. Craig Browning, a sophomore who sat out last season with a kidney ailment, is the number-one quarterback after the spring drills. Stanley Broadie, another Blue Devil who was forced to miss all of last season, and leading rusher Greg Rhett will be the top running backs for Duke.

For the first time in many years Wake Forest has a lot of depth returning at key spots. In all, 17 starters return for John Mackovic's second season at Wake Forest. The Deacons also had an outstanding recruiting season, that included the signing of quarterback Brent Offenbecher, one of the top players in Ohio last year.

Mackovic loves to throw the ball and it is anticipated that the Deacons will again put the ball in the air often. Quarterback David Webber, split end Wayne Baumgardner and tight end Mike Mullen all return. The top running back is James McDougald.

The senior halfback is already Wake Forest's all-time leading rusher. His total for last season was only 629 yards because of the Deacons pass-oriented attack.

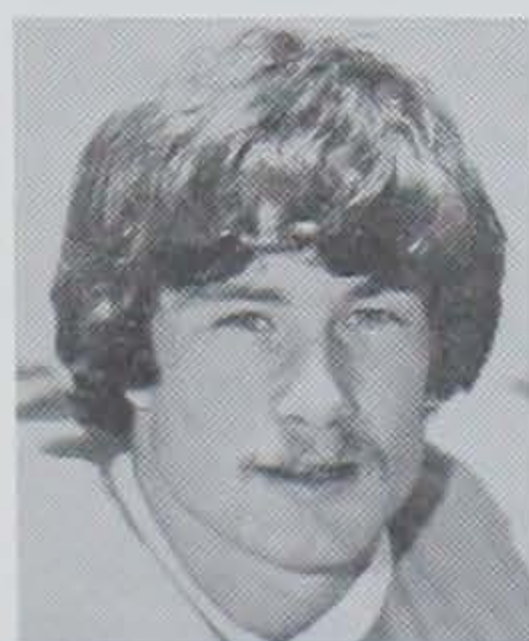

## 1979 OUTLOOK

Despite the loss of 11 starters to graduation, including All-ACC performers Mike Salzano and Bob Loomis, the North Carolina Tar Heels have high hopes of fielding a much improved football team in 1979. North Carolina slumped to 5-6 in Dick Crum's first year after having attended six bowls in the previous eight seasons under Bill Dooley.

Carolina finds the biggest rebuilding problems on defense. Gone are seven starters, including three defensive backs. The four returnees on defense are cornerback Ricky Barden, tackle Donnell Thompson and linebackers Buddy Curry and Darrell Nicholson. All should be in contention for all-conference honors, and Barden has a good shot at some All-America mention.

Offensively, the Tar Heels have a chance to be very sound. Amos Lawrence is the most highly publicized player on the North Carolina team. Ever since he gained 286 yards his rookie year against Virginia to set an NCAA record for a freshman he has been in the limelight. Lawrence was injured much of last season, but still gained over 1,000 yards for the second straight year.

Joining Lawrence in the backfield should be quarterback Matt Kupec and running back Doug Paschal, both starters from the 1978 team. Kupec completed 58.7 percent of his passes last year, while Paschal was the team's second leading rusher with nearly 500 yards.

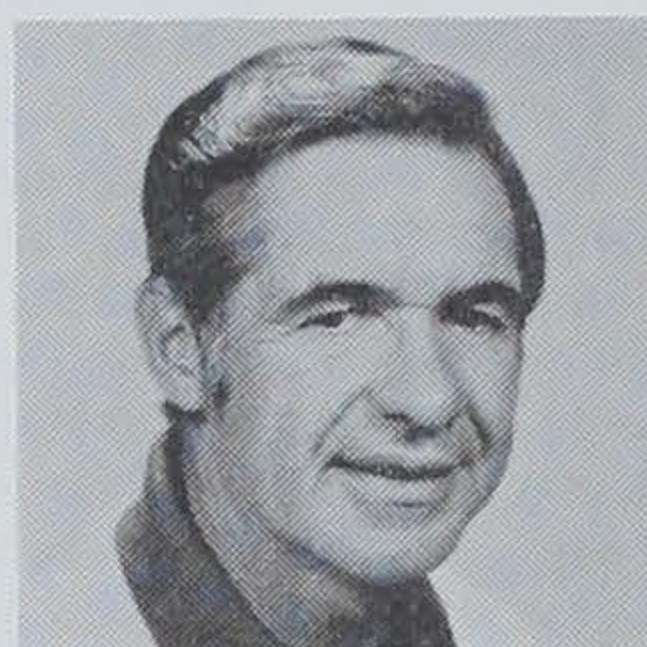

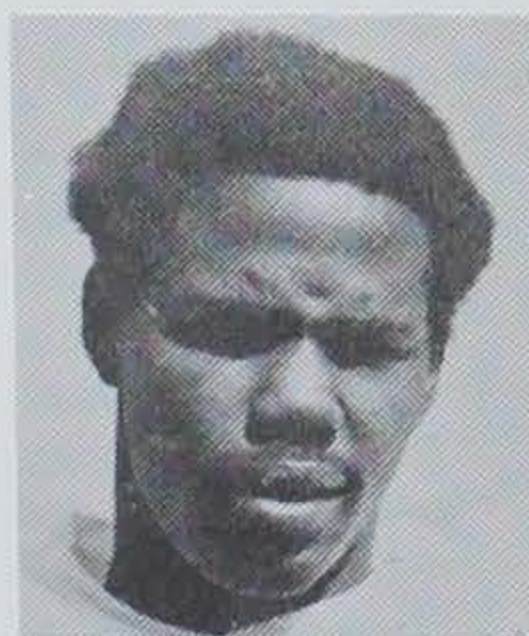

The Fighting Irish are in the same boat as Clemson — finding themselves inexperienced at many of the skilled positions. Gone is miracle worker Joe Montana, all-time leading rusher Jerome Heavens, leading receiver Kris Haines, All-American center Dave Huffman, all-time punting leader Joe Restic and the two top tacklers in Notre Dame history, linebackers Bob Golic and Steve Heimkrieter.

The Notre Dame strengths lie in the offensive line, where Tim Foley, a preseason All-American, Tim Huffman, and Rob Martinovich are all proven veterans. Vagas Ferguson is one of the best backs in America. The senior Heisman candidate rushed

for a Notre Dame record 1,192 yards in 1978, including a record 255 yards against Georgia Tech in Atlanta last year.

Rusty Lisch is the top candidate to take over Montana's place at quarterback. Lisch, a 6-4 senior, was Notre Dame's starting quarterback in the first three games of 1977, the year the Irish won the national championship.

The top defensive players are preseason All-American David Waymer (DB), linebacker Bobby Leopold and defensive lineman John Hankerd. The status of Scott Zettek, an oft-injured, but star caliber defensive end, will be a key to Notre Dame's season. Zettek underwent knee surgery for the second time in two years last spring.

With 18 of 22 starters returning from last fall, plus an impressive cast of newcomers available, Jim Carlen is justified when saying, "I'm looking forward to this season more than any other since I've been at Carolina."

Ten of those returning starters will be on offense, a unit that was strong last year. The Gamecocks ran for 310 yards against Clemson last season, the most by a Tiger opponent in 1978. The top player on the offense is All-America candidate George Rogers. The junior from Duluth, GA ran for 1,006 yards with a 5.7 play average. Fellow junior Johnnie Wright gives the Gamecocks one of the best

junior combinations in the land. Wright ran for over 900 yards in 1978.

The starting quarterback will undoubtedly be Garry Harper. Another experienced junior, Harper completed just under 50 percent of his passes last year. His favorite target should be Zion McKinney.

Three veterans anchor the defensive line. Seniors Brett Bond, Steve Bernish and Fred Sinclair give Carlen a solid nucleus for his "fifty" defense. Consecutive unsportsmanlike conduct penalties gave the Tigers excellent field position and Steve Fuller ran out the clock, giving Clemson its first win ever over a Big 10 team.

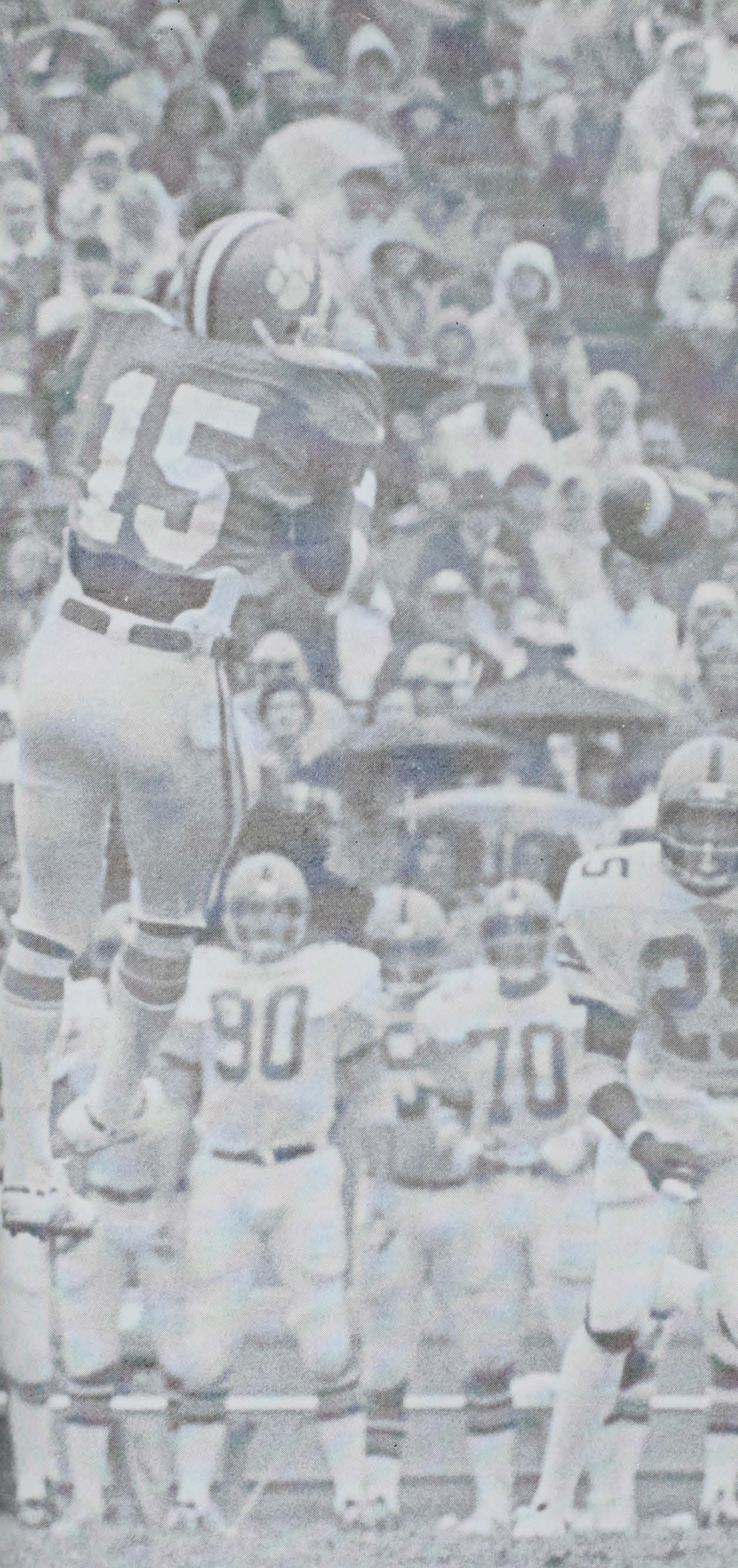

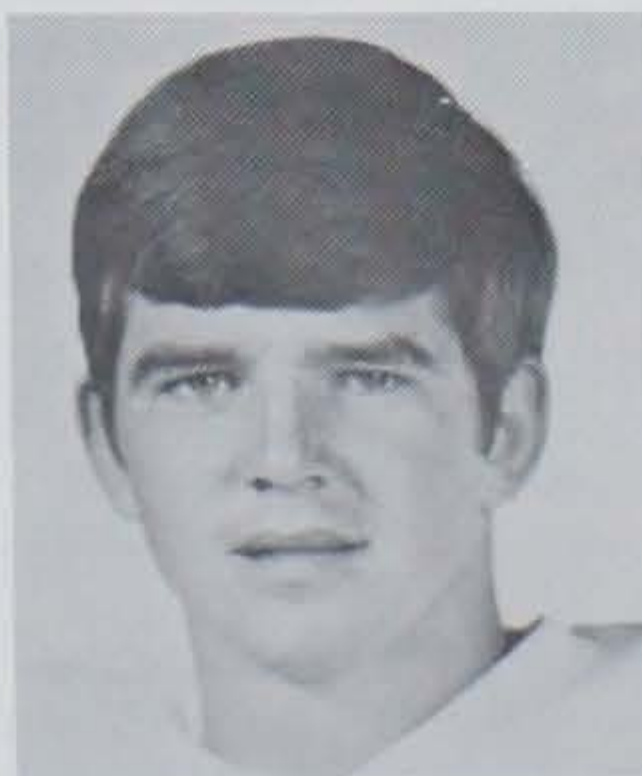

## **Clemson Memorial Stadium — "Death Valley"**

In the past 37 seasons, 28 teams have made appearances in Clemson Memorial Stadium, now pretty widely known as "Death Valley" eight teams (George Washington, Kentucky, Alabama, Georgia, Auburn, Texas A&M, Florida State, Maryland and Notre Dame) have an edge on the Tigers' home ground and five of these (George Washington, Kentucky, Florida State, Texas A&M and Notre Dame), have just played one game in Memorial Stadium.

Clemson has shutout opponents 31 times in "Death Valley" (Presbyterian 9 times; N. C. State 4; Wake Forest 3; Virginia, Furman, Citadel and Duquesne twice each; and VPI, Auburn, Duke, North Carolina, Texas Christian, Villanova and Maryland, once each). The Tigers have been shutout 10 times at home in 37 seasons, the last time being in 1976 when Georgia blanked Clemson 41-0.



Between the Maryland shutout in 1953 and the Duke blanking in 1962, the Tigers scored in 38 consecutive home games.

There have been three ties in 158 games played in the stadium, one with Mississippi State in 1949, one with Georgia in 1963, and the 1976 18-18 Duke deadlock.

In 1974 the field was named The Frank Howard Field of Clemson Memorial Stadium in honor of the Tigers' legendary coach Frank Howard.

But last season, something new became synonymous with a Tiger tally. In the endzone facing the student section, Zack Mills, better known as the Clemson Tiger, would perform his appointed chores, pushups.

For every point the Tigers put on the scoreboard last season, Mills, Clemson's goodwill ambassador, would do a push-up. That sounds easy, but Zack did the pushups cumulatively. 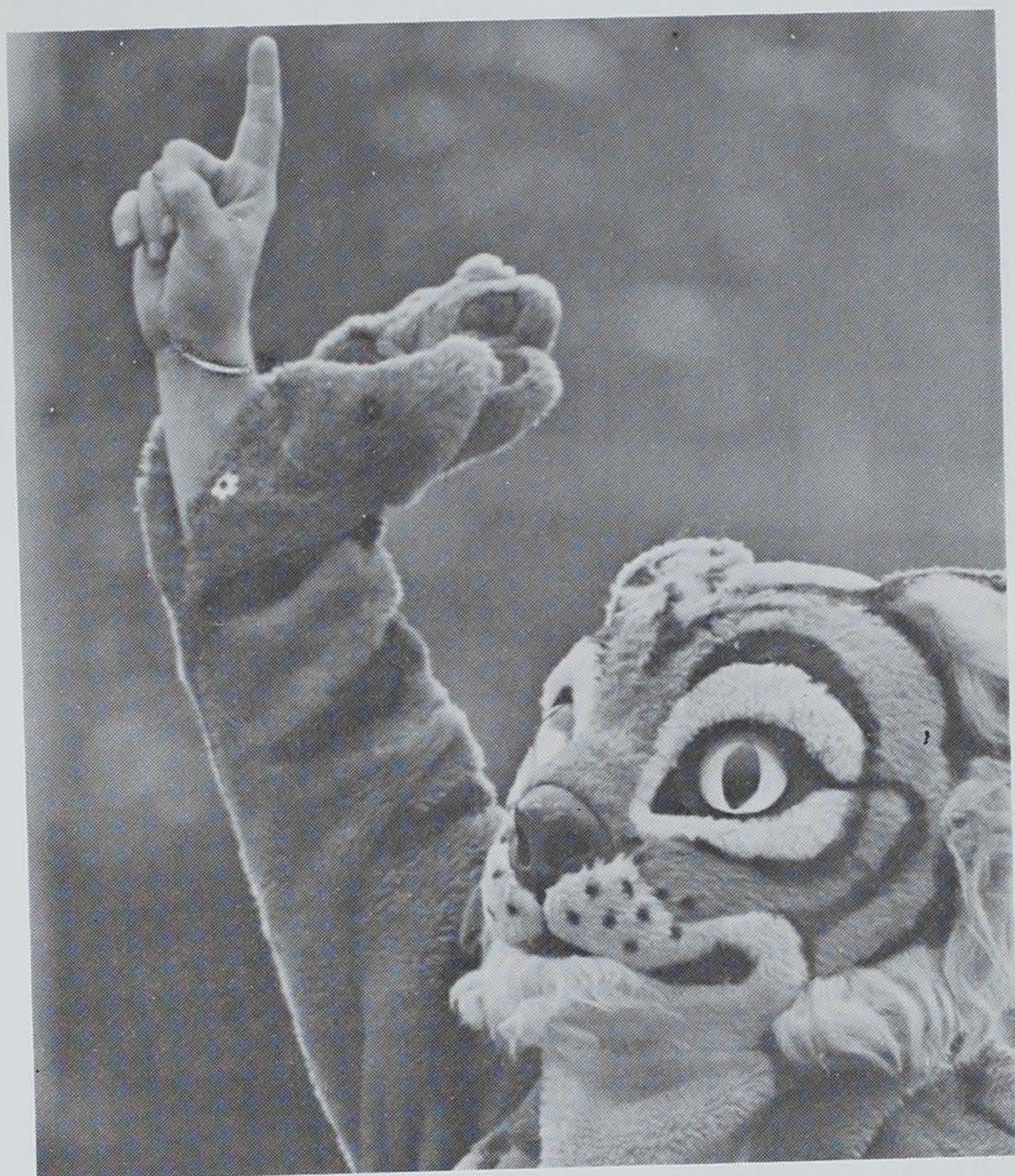

With a season left in his varsity career, Mills has at least 11 games in which to establish new career/game and season pushup records. Zack has been quoted as saying that he especially wants to break the single game record, but hopes the football team will wait for a cool day for him to challenge the mark.

# CLEMSON UNIVERSITY

**"... this side of Heaven"**

"Clemson is just a little this side of Heaven — one stop before Heaven, you might say."

Those are the words of Joe Sherman '34 who gave 34½ years of service to his alma mater before he retired as the University's Director of Alumni Relations in June of 1977.



In actuality, Clemson University's 600-acre campus, located in the northwest corner of South Carolina, lies in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains and is surrounded by the sparkling blue waters of Lake Hartwell. More than 70 modern, well-equipped buildings now occupy the area that once was Fort Hill, the homestead of U. S. Vice-President John C. Calhoun and University Founder Thomas G. Clemson.

The University's heritage is maintained, however, by the many old trees, lots of open green areas, and quiet walkways. From several points on campus and around this lovely college town, Lake Hartwell and the Blue Ridge Mountains provide a spectacular and inspiring view.

The Tillman clock tower, which is visible from just about everywhere on campus, and the Outdoor Theatre, which is the scene of concerts and pep rallies, are among traditional landmarks. They become comforting and familiar friends to everyone who becomes a part of Clemson.

The students, hailing from 46 states and 43 foreign countries, are offered 78 fields of study in nine undergraduate colleges, and 54 areas of graduate study.

The undergraduate academic units are the Colleges of Agricultural Sciences; Architecture; Education; Engineering; Forest and Recreation Resources; Industrial Management and Textile Science; Liberal Arts; Nursing; and Sciences.

Of the University's total enrollment of 11,478, the actual on-campus figure is 10,471, of which 61 per cent are male and 39 per cent female.

Sherman once wrote an article about Clemson on the theme that "There's Something In These Hills." It said, in part:

"There's something in these hills that brings together and binds together and holds together men and women of all persuasions, of all heights, sizes, weights, and cultural backgrounds — something that cuts across every difference, spans every gap, penetrates every wall — something that makes a man or a woman stand taller, feel better and say to all within earshot, 'I went to Clemson!'"

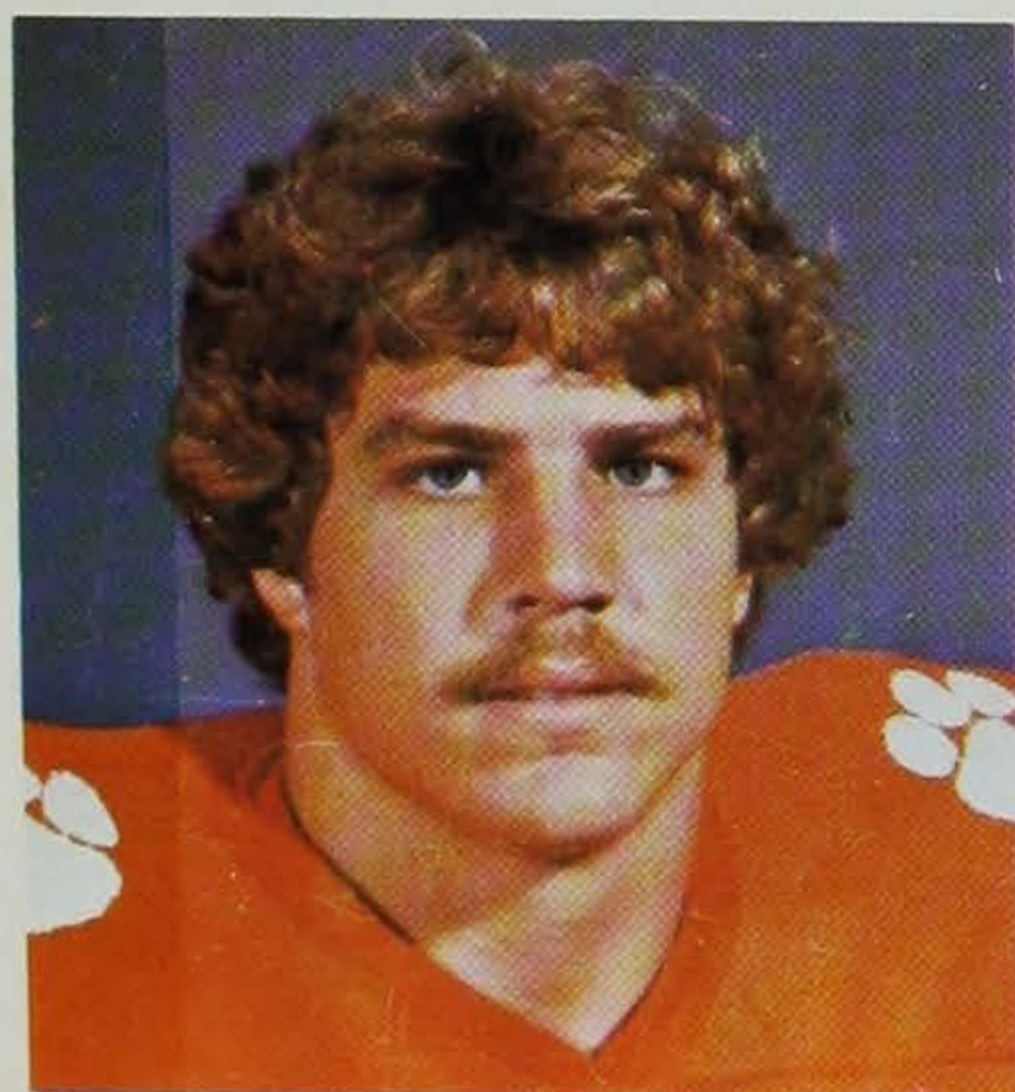

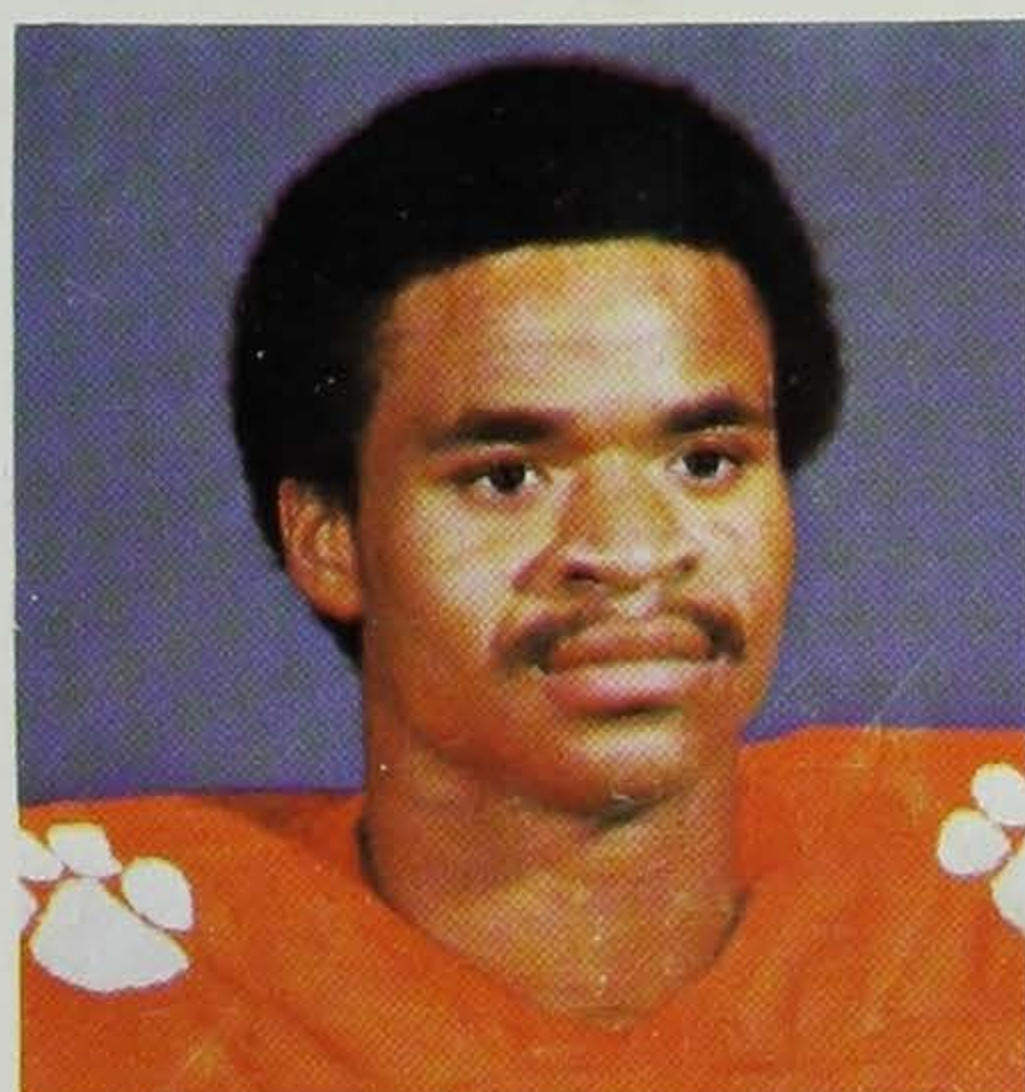
