# ***Press, Radio and TV***

If you're assigned to cover a game in Clemson's Memorial Stadium this fall, the following hints will be helpful:

## **ENTRANCE TO STADIUM/PRESS BOX**

Enter through Gate 14 which is located on the press box (South) side of the field at the southeast corner. Should you have need to pick up tickets at our press will call gate, they will be at Gate 14. Come through Gate 14, turn right, and go straight to the elevator which will take you to the press box.

## **PRESS BOX**

There are two levels to Clemson's new press box, located in the center of the club level of the South stands. The first level contains the photo deck, the outside PA, stadium operations & security, along with booths for field telephones, radio, networks and athletic directors for Clemson and the visiting team. The second level will be for the print media, with seating accommodations for 100 members of the working press. This level will also house Clemson's famous buffet, and the telecopier room. There is a dark room on the photo level.

## **WORKING CREDENTIALS**

We'll appreciate getting these as early as you know your assignment. Requests for working press and photo passes are honored from SPORTS EDITORS of DAILY newspapers and RADIO & TV SPORTS DIRECTORS **ONLY**. Make request directly to BOB BRADLEY, preferably a week in advance of kickoff to insure adequate mailing time. Spouses, dates, non-workers, and anyone 16 years of age or younger, are not permitted in the press box.

## **PARKING PASSES AND COMPLIMENTARY TICKETS**

There are a limited number of these available for use by the members of the working press, and the sooner we know of your need, the closer we will come to filling your request. Your request should be made directly to BOB BRADLEY.

## **TELECOPIER AND WESTERN UNION SERVICES**

Our press box is equipped with eight (8) outside lines and outlets for your telecopiers, and at no charge to your paper. We will have three telecopiers at the game which can be used on a first-come, first-serve basis, and we also have press box assistants who are available to send your copy as necessary. **THERE IS NO CHARGE FOR ANY OF THESE SERVICES.** It is the responsibility of each writer to make prior arrangements with Western Union for that company's service. Electrical and telephone outlets are at each seat for other equipment.

We furnish a typed play-by-play, individual and team stats, and coaches' quotes. Also, our communications center staff furnishes a packet of first half action shots — six 8 x 10 black and white prints.

## **LOCKER ROOM INTERVIEWS**

Bob Bradley will escort those writers wishing to go to the Clemson dressing room, whereas the visiting SID will make the trip to the opponent's dressing area. This usually takes place with about three minutes showing on the scoreboard clock. The dressing rooms are located beneath the West end zone stands, opposite the scoreboard end of the field.

**Between these covers you should find just about everything you need to know about the Tigers. Please don't hesitate, however, to call on us at any time.**

## BILL McLELLAN, Athletic Director

Only the third man to own the title of Athletic Director at Clemson over the past 46 years, Bill McLellan was elevated to his present position February 4, 1971, following what had been more than a decade of service to the University's athletic organization.



A native of Hamer, S. C., the 46-year old McLellan graduated from Dillon High School and entered Clemson where he earned a pair of football letters, and was a member of the Tigers' 1952 Gator Bowl team.

He joined the athletic staff May 1, 1958 from Clemson's Department of Agricultural Economics and Seed Certification where he had spent one year as assistant agronomist and two years as assistant economist.

Although carrying the title of Assistant Business Manager, McLellan has been credited with handling the majority of the department's athletic business and operation long before his appointment into his present role.

In 1966, McLellan was named Assistant Athletic Director, and two years later was appointed Associate Athletic Director.

During his reign as Athletic Director, Clemson's athletic program has experienced a major upheaval.

The Tigers can boast of the finest athletic facilities in not only the Atlantic Coast Conference, but in the South as well.

The modern and spacious Jervay Athletic Center is one of the most complete facilities in America, and this complex serves as the home for Clemson's 18 sports — 12 men's and six women's.

The basketball Tigers play before packed crowds in attractive Littlejohn Coliseum, and many of the Clemson games are telecast on either regional or national networks.

And the football Tigers, after averaging better than 47,000 at home last fall, will be playing in a remodeled Memorial Stadium this year that will have some 53,000 permanent seats.

But conference titles and All-American honors have come to other sports as well, and McLellan's direction has given Clemson a program that was ranked 21st in the nation in overall excellence in 1977-78. Moreover, no less than six Clemson teams were ranked in the nation's top twenty — football, cross country, fencing, soccer, golf, and baseball.

McLellan earned a BS degree from Clemson in agronomy in '54 and a master's in agricultural economics in '56. He is married to the former Ann Rogers of Fork, S. C. They have four children — Suzy, who just graduated from Winthrop; Bill, who recently finished at Spartanburg Methodist College; Cliff, a sophomore at Tennessee Tech; and Arch Anna, a junior at Pendleton High School.

## **CHARLEY PELL, Head Football Coach**

### **1977 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year**

Charles Byron (Charley) Pell was named Clemson's 20th head football coach December 1, 1976, and authored college football's Cinderella story in 1977.

The 37-year old Albertville, Ala. product took a team that was 3-6-2 in 1976 and led the '77 Tigers to a sparkling 8-2-1 ledger and a berth in the Gator Bowl. He was a near unanimous choice as Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, garnering 116 of 124 votes by the league's sportswriters.



A two-way starter and three-year letterwinner at Alabama, Pell was a member of the Crimson Tide's 1961 National Championship team and played in the Orange, Sugar, and Bluebonnet Bowls during his 'Bama career.

He came to Clemson in 1976 and served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator that year.

Pell entered the coaching profession as a graduate assistant to his former tutor, Paul "Bear" Bryant in '64.

Charlie Bradshaw hired the young Pell as defensive line coach at the University of Kentucky where the latter spent the next four years, from '65 through '68.

Pell's first taste of head coaching came in December of '68 when he was selected to rebuild the Jacksonville, Ala., State University grid program.

During the next five seasons, '69 through '73, Pell built aggressive defensive teams that garnered a five-year mark of 33-13-1, including a 30-7-1 ledger his last four campaigns.

His 1970 JSU team was 10-0 which included a 21-7 win over Florida A&M in the Orange Blossom Classic, and was ranked second in the nation. His '72 team finished 10th nationally, and his '73 squad ranked fourth.

In '70, he was conference, district, area, and state of Alabama Coach of the Year, and runner-up for national coaching honors. He earned the state accolade again in '73.

He joined VPI's staff as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator in 1974, and remained there until coming to Clemson.

Pell took a defensive unit that ranked 128th nationally prior to his arrival and molded it into one that finished the '75 season as 29th toughest against scoring.

Pell earned his BS degree in business administration from Alabama in '64. He is married to the former Ward Noel of Lexington, Ky., and they have a son — Carrick (8).

**PLAYING EXPERIENCE:** High School — Played only one year at Albertville (Ala.) High. College — Earned three letters from Alabama as OG and DT (1960-62).

**EDUCATION:** Graduated from Albertville (Ala.) High in 1959. Earned a BS in business administration from Alabama in 1964.

**PERSONAL DATA:** Born Charles Byron Pell in Albertville, Ala. on February 27, 1941. Married Ward Noel of Lexington, Ky. on February 1, 1969. Children: (1) Carrick (3/1/70).

**BOWL PARTICIPATION:** As a player: 1960 Bluebonnet Bowl, 1962 Sugar Bowl, 1963 Orange Bowl as Alabama player. As a coach — 1970 Orange Blossom Bowl as Jacksonville State head coach, 1977 Gator Bowl as Clemson head coach.



Was conference, district, area, and state of Alabama Coach of the Year after 10-0 season at Jacksonville State in 1970. Was also runnerup for national coach of the Year that same season. Was NCAA District III, Atlantic Coast Conference, and State of South Carolina Coach of the Year in 1977 at Clemson.



**PREVIOUS COACHING EXPERIENCE:** High School — Assistant coach at Newport News (Va.) High, 1 year, (1970). College — Graduate assistant at Clemson, 2 years (1971-72); assistant at The Citadel, 2 years, (1973-74); assistant at Memphis State, 2 years, (1975-76).



**YEARS AT CLEMSON** 5th. Joined staff as graduate assistant in 1973, resigned to go to Wofford, returned to staff on July 1, 1975 from Wofford.

**RESPONSIBILITIES:** Assist with coaching of the offensive linemen. Recruit upper North Carolina, parts of Ohio, and central and western Virginia.

## A LOOK AT CLEMSON FOR 1978

Optimism is a byword in the Clemson football outlook with a group of 43 returning lettermen, including 13 who drew starting assignments in last year's Gator Bowl. But, with Tiger coach Charley Pell entering his second season at the Clemson helm, the mentor knows there is a lot of work to do.

"We have some critical areas for this football team," says Pell. "There is some talent on this team, with the strong point being the solid group of returning starters, but we all must again do the little things that helped the team be successful last year."

Successful is one way of putting the 1977 campaign. The Tigers began with a narrow 21-14 loss to Maryland and then proceeded to reel off seven consecutive victories en route to an 8-2-1 regular season and their first trip to a post season bowl game since 1959.

During that stretch the Tigers rose to as high as tenth in the nation prior to the North Carolina game. After a tie with the Tar Heels in the Atlantic Coast Conference showdown in Chapel Hill, Clemson suffered their final regular season setback, a 21-17 decision at the hands of eventual national champion Notre Dame. The Tigers then closed out their regular season with the thrilling 31-27 regionally televised win over South Carolina. Following that decision, Clemson once again rose to tenth spot in the UPI poll and eleventh by the Associated Press.

Returning from that exciting 1977 contingent is a group of six players who were selected to the All-ACC team. Along with the other 37 returning lettermen, some new faces and the possibility of help from the incoming freshmen, Pell and his staff will mold the 1978 unit.

Offensively, the Tigers return one of the nation's premier passing combos in quarterback Steve Fuller, the 1977 ACC Player-of-the-Year, and All-America Jerry Butler. Fuller set the Clemson single season records one year ago with 1,655 yards passing and 2,092 yards of total offense. 824 yards of that passing total, plus four touchdowns, went to the fleet Butler, a 6-1, 180 pound package of speed and moves. Fuller will also have the talented Dwight Clark as another receiver. Last year Clark caught 17 passes for 265 yards while splitting time at flanker with Rick Weddington, who has graduated. The backfield will take on much the same look with the trio of tailbacks returning in the form of Warren Ratchford, Lester Brown, and Harold Goggins. Ratchford, who has led the team in rushing in each of the last two seasons, ranks tenth on the career rushing list with 1,318 yards. Brown led the team in scoring last year with nine touchdowns for 54 points while Goggins is coming off a fine spring, having won the Frank Jervey Fourth Quarter Award for outstanding achievement during the off season conditioning program and the spring drills. Spring was also a time spent concentrating on producing a stronger inside running game. Fullbacks Marvin Sims and Tracy Perry emerged with strong performances.

The offensive line remains the critical area for the 1978 Tigers. With three returnees — Joe Bostic, Jeff Bostic, and Steve Kenney — Pell must find two starters at tackle and some dependable backup help. The pair of senior guards, Joe Bostic and Kenney, were outstanding during 1977 with Bostic making the first team Football Writers All-America team. He

was also the ACC and South Carolina Jacobs Blocking Trophy winner becoming the first Tiger since All-America guard Harry Olszewski pulled that same trick in 1967. Kenney was one of the team's solid performers and will be looked for much the same in 1978. And brother Jeff Bostic, giving the Tigers the only brother combo playing side by side in college football, returns for his junior year after being an All-State performer as a sophomore. Behind this trio Pell must find some help. It could come in the form of Billy Hudson, Chris Dolce, and Ron Locke. But from whomever, this remains one area to measure the Tigers rise or fall in '78.

Defensively, look for the Tigers to continue to improve. When Pell came to Tigertown as the defensive coordinator prior to the 1976 season, he found the state of affairs in shambles. Clemson had ranked among the nation's worst as far as defense in 1975, a significant reason for that season's failures. With some improvement in 1976, the Tigers became one of the nations top defensive clubs in '77, rising to as high as fourth in scoring defense.

All-ACC performers return in the form of end Jonathan Brooks, linebacker Randy Scott, and free safety Steve Ryan. Along with some other outstanding players, such as linebacker Bubba Brown, tackle Jim Stuckey, and cornerback Rex Varn, Pell has a solid group to build on. Critical areas include a search for more depth at linebacker and making some adjustments in the secondary.

The front wall, the first line of defense, returns three starters in Brooks, Stuckey, and middle guard Rich Tuten. Along with end Steve Gibbs and tackle Toney Williams, who will fill two holes left by graduation, this area looks solid. Charlie Bauman will back up at middle guard to give that position a good look.

The linebacker group looked as bare as Mother Hubbard's Cupboard at the beginning of spring when Randy Scott and Jim Goehring were on the sidelines after undergoing some off-season surgery. However, along with returnee Bubba Brown, the duo returned near the end of the drills and gives this group a stable outlook. The coaches will be looking for another player to give them a pair at each side.

In the secondary, Tiger fans and opposing offensive players will see Ryan at free safety with Bubba Rollins and Willie Jordan at strong safety. Eddie Geathers, a part time starter last season as a freshman, and Rex Varn, who missed only two games last year after undergoing an emergency appendectomy, return at the corners. Jordan began the '77 campaign on the offensive field but when early season injuries depleted the secondary, Jordan was summoned back to his position of the 1976 season. He has now been moved to the safety slot.

During his first season as head coach, Pell stressed the kicking game. Beginning the 1978 season, the stable looks quite a bit better than it did this time last year. Sophomore David Sims returns after a solid first year which saw him battle a pulled hamstring near the conclusion. That has healed and he should return to the form he gained during mid-season. The placekicking chores will be handled by junior Obed Ariri, another Tiger who made the best of his chances last season. Ariri began as the long range kicker but soon inherited all of the kicking duties and made this a Tiger strong point. Along the way, the former soccer player

at Tigertown booted four field goals against Wake Forest to set a Clemson standard for most in one game and among that total was a 57-yarder which set another Tiger mark.

## **Coach Charley Pell Comments on . . .**

### **THE OFFENSE**

#### **THE QUARTERBACKS**

"Steve Fuller is certainly one of the outstanding quarterbacks in the nation. He had a good spring and all things point for him to have an outstanding senior year. Most of our spring was spent with Billy Lott, Mike Gasque, and Bo Blanton to establish a solid backup for Fuller. I am satisfied with the progress of Billy (Lott) and Mike (Gasque) and have confidence in their capabilities for 1978."

#### **THE RUNNING BACKS**

"One of the highlights of the spring was the progress of our fullbacks, Marvin Sims and Tracy Perry. Both are big and strong and should add a great deal to our offense. We have three tailbacks, Harold Goggins, Lester Brown, and Warren Ratchford, all of whom finished strong in the spring. Willie Underwood worked out at running back in the spring but we have moved him to flanker for the fall."

#### **THE RECEIVERS**

"There is just none better than Jerry Butler and his ability causes some folks to underrate Dwight Clark, who is an exceptional athlete at flanker. These two give us a solid combination at the outside receivers. The tight end competition between Anthony King and newcomer Ed Abreu will help that position and make it a promising area. We need some backups at the two outside positions."

#### **THE OFFENSIVE LINE**

"The biggest challenge facing our football team is the rebuilding of the offensive line. We lost four players from the inside and they must be replaced. We have three outstanding players in Joe Bostic, Jeff Bostic, and Steve Kenney who return. Chris Dolce, Billy Hudson, and Ron Locke have shown promise but the question of depth must be resolved before this team reaches its potential."

### **THE DEFENSE**

#### **THE FRONT LINE**

"This may have been our most consistent area during the spring practices. Jim Stuckey is bigger and stronger at one tackle and Toney Williams and Steve Durham will anchor the other tackle. Middle guard looks good with returning starter Rich Tuten and Charlie Bauman sharing the playing time. We have not replaced the pass rush of Archie Reese, who graduated, and we have got to have a couple of more players in this area but overall this should be a strong area."

#### **THE ENDS**

"Experience, depth, and ability will make this one of our strongest positions on the football team. Jonathan Brooks (All-ACC in '77) and Steve Gibbs return along with David Reed and Bill Smith, both of whom performed well in the spring. Hank Cobb, Rick Wyatt, and Buddy Hopkins also could help out here."

#### **THE LINEBACKERS**

"Randy Scott and Bubba Brown will provide a strong first unit, especially with Randy's excellent recovery from surgery."

Jim Goehring, Matt Smith, Jeff Soowal, and Chuck Rose all are capable of seeing playing time. Progress here in the early parts of the fall workouts could be critical as we need two strong players to backup that first unit.”

## **THE SECONDARY**

“Position changes here have proved beneficial to our football team and should make us a better defensive unit. We moved Eddie Geathers from right to left corner to team up with Rex Varn. Along with the progress of Al Latimer, the cornerback has solid potential. We also moved Willie Jordan to strong safety and along with Bubba Rollins, has made this a stronger area. Steve Ryan is a returning starter at free safety. Ogden Hansford moved in and had his best spring ever before having to have surgery. Even though there is much to be done, the progress and potential in the secondary is encouraging.”

## **THE KICKING GAME**

“We had a difficult spring in many ways. We are certain we didn’t accomplish all we would have liked but it ended on a strong note with an exciting spring game. I feel like we are on the right track but we have plenty of work ahead of us if we are to reach our full potential.”

## **STRENGTHS**

“Certainly our strong point is the group of proven players that we have returning, particularly defensive end and fullback.

## **WEAKNESSES**

“The lack of proven depth in several areas is critical. We are looking for some maturity and growth prior to the start of the fall practices, and need some incoming freshmen ready to help early.

## **SCHEDULE**

“Our 1978 schedule will be a very dangerous one. We will face four teams (Citadel, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest, North Carolina) with new coaching staffs and that will present a challenging element. Each of these four teams will have a new and enthusiastic outlook. We open with a cross state rivalry in The Citadel who we were lucky to beat in my first year here (10-7 in 1976). Going between the hedges at Georgia is enough said for the toughness of that game. Our ACC schedule is most competitive as the league is getting stronger each year with any team capable of winning. And the season finale with South Carolina will be another great game, I am sure.”

We also have some other young players, such as Jim Stuckey, Bubba Brown, and Rex Varn who are just as capable of making the post season teams.”




Five times the Sportscaster of the Year in South Carolina, Phillips is regarded as the top play-by-play man in the state and one of the best in the South.

## SIMS CARRIES ORANGE TO 18-17 WIN OVER WHITE

Fullback Marvin Sims bulled over from the three yard line with the two point conversion and lifted the Orange to an 18-17 come-from-behind win over the White team before a crowd of over 15,000 in the annual Tigertown Spring Game.

The Orange team had drawn to within one at 17-16 with just over three minutes to play on another patented Jerry Butler catch, this one of a Mike Gasque aerial from nine yards out for the touchdown. Then Sims, the rising junior from Phenix City, Ala., carried over for the winning two points.

For Sims, the conversion capped a big day that saw the 6-4, 223-pounder rush for 135 yards on 19 carries to pace the Orange attack.

The game was also highlighted by the return to the sidelines of two of Tigertown's most famous football coaches, Jess Neely and Frank Howard. Neely, who guided the Tigers from 1931-1939, was the head mentor of the White squad while Howard, who was Clemson's head coach from 1940-1969, claimed victory as the Orange leader.

The Orange team took a 3-0 lead in the first quarter on a 33 yard Jimmy Russell field goal and then increased that to 10-0 when Lester Brown raced nine yards for a touchdown.

Obed Ariri, the hero of last year's spring game, cut that margin to 10-3 on the final play of the first half with a 25 yard field goal.

In the second half, Jeff Soowal's interception and return to the Orange 27 gave the White team excellent field position. Six plays later Billy Lott connected with Anthony King for a three yard touchdown to knot the score at 10-10.

The White squad took a 17-10 lead with just under ten minutes to play as Lott fired a 37 yard touchdown pass to Dwight Clark on a fourth and twenty situation.

However, the Orange team showed their mettle as they drove 80 yards for the winning tally, with Sims accounting for 39 of that total on four carries plus the two point conversion.

Then, after stopping the White team's final drive at their own 45 yard line, Orange quarterback Mike Gasque handed off to Sims on six straight plays to run out the clock. The bruising fullback made three first downs during the six cracks.





## Clemson Memorial Stadium — "Death Valley"

In the past 36 seasons, 28 teams have made appearances in Clemson's Memorial Stadium, now pretty widely known as "Death Valley." Nine teams (George Washington, Kentucky, Villanova, Alabama, Georgia, Auburn, Texas A&M, Florida State, Maryland and Notre Dame) have an edge on the Tigers' home ground and six of these, (George Washington, Kentucky, Villanova, Florida State, Texas A&M and Notre Dame, have just played one game in Memorial Stadium.

Clemson has shutout opponents 30 times in "Death Valley" (Presbyterian 9 times; N. C. State 4; Wake Forest 3; Virginia, Furman, Citadel and Duquesne twice each; and VPI, Auburn, Duke, North Carolina, Texas Christian and Maryland, once each). The Tigers have been shutout 10 times at home in 36 seasons, the last time being in 1976 when Georgia blanked Clemson 41-0.

Between the Maryland shutout in 1953 and the Duke blanking in 1962, the Tigers scored in 38 consecutive home games.

There have been three ties in 147 games played in the stadium, one with Mississippi State in 1949, one with Georgia in 1963, and last fall's 18-18 Duke deadlock.

In 1974 the field was named The Frank Howard Field of Clemson Memorial Stadium in honor of the Tigers' legendary coach Frank Howard.





# CLEMSON UNIVERSITY

**"... this side of Heaven"**

"Clemson is just a little this side of Heaven — one stop before Heaven, you might say."

Those are the words of Joe Sherman '34 who gave 34½ years of service to his alma mater before he retired as the University's Director of Alumni Relations in June of 1977.



In actuality, Clemson University's 600-acre campus, located in the northwest corner of South Carolina, lies in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains and is surrounded by the sparkling blue waters of Lake Hartwell. More than 70 modern, well-equipped buildings now occupy the area that once was Fort Hill, the homestead of U. S. Vice-President John C. Calhoun and University Founder Thomas G. Clemson.

The University's heritage is maintained, however, by the many old trees, lots of open green areas, and quiet walkways. From several points on campus and around this lovely college town, Lake Hartwell and the Blue Ridge Mountains provide a spectacular and inspiring view.

The Tillman clock tower, which is visible from just about everywhere on campus, and the Outdoor Theatre, which is the scene of concerts and pep rallies, are among traditional landmarks. They become comforting and familiar friends to everyone who becomes a part of Clemson.

The students, hailing from 46 states and 43 foreign countries, are offered 78 fields of study in nine undergraduate colleges, and 54 areas of graduate study.

The undergraduate academic units are the Colleges of Agricultural Sciences; Architecture; Education; Engineering; Forest and Recreation Resources; Industrial Management and Textile Science; Liberal Arts; Nursing; and Sciences.

Of the University's total enrollment of 11,274, the actual on-campus figure is 10,382, of which 60 per cent are male and 40 per cent female.

Sherman once wrote an article about Clemson on the theme that "There's Something In These Hills." It said, in part:

"There's something in these hills that brings together and binds together and holds together men and women of all persuasions, of all heights, sizes, weights, and cultural backgrounds — something that cuts across every difference, spans every gap, penetrates every wall — something that makes a man or a woman stand taller, feel better and say to all within earshot, 'I went to Clemson!' "
