STATEMENT BY J. STROM THURMOND, GOVERNOR OF SOUTH CAROLINA, ANNOUNCING APPOINTMENT OF MR. E. H. TALBERT TO SERVE AS FUEL COORDINATOR OF SOUTH CAROLINA DURING COAL SHORTAGE EMERGENCY. MARCH 2, 1950.

Arrangements have been made through the Secretary of Defense for Army, Navy, and Air Force installations to make coal available until March 15 for relief of severe civilian hardship.

I have appointed Mr. E. H. Talbert, Director, Surplus Property Procurement Division of the Research, Planning and Development Board to act as fuel coordinator in this matter. Applications for coal to relieve extreme emergencies should be filed with Mr. Talbert.
