

A P R O C L A M A T I O N

(United Nations Week)

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the United Nations adopted a resolution naming October 24th as United Nations Day, and

WHEREAS, October 24, 1950, marks the completion of the fifth year in which the United Nations has endeavored to transform a shattered world into a better habitation for the human race, and

WHEREAS, the United Nations has instilled in the peoples of the world a renewed faith that by cooperative international effort they may succeed in effectuating security, justice and lasting peace, for all mankind;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J. Strom Thurmond, Governor of South Carolina, do hereby designate and proclaim the week of October 22 - 28, 1950, as United Nations Week and call upon all civic, educational and religious organizations, and upon individual citizens to rededicate themselves to the principles of the United Nations and to cooperate fully in programs dedicated to strengthening our participation in the work of the United Nations.
