Ketchum University, along with her coworker, Michelle Schonken, lead the Whitelist Working Group and Whitelist Reviewers of the Association of Vision Science Librarians (AVSL). In July, the group was awarded the 2020 Medical Library Association Louise Darling Medal for Distinguished Achievement in Collection Development in the Health Sciences. The AVSL Whitelist of Vision Science Journals includes journals in the fields of vision science, optometry, and ophthalmology that have been evaluated and identified as non-predatory.
