

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Apr. 12, 1950

CALLING UPON THE BUDGET COMMISSION TO
RESCIND ITS ORDER OF APRIL 1, 1950, RE-
DUCING THE APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CURRENT
YEAR.

WHEREAS, The Budget Commission has ordered a six (6%) per cent reduction in all appropriation items for the current year to avoid a deficit in the State's General Fund, as required by Section 89 of the 1949-50 Appropriations Act, and

WHEREAS, said reduction of appropriations will result in considerable hardship to the State's employees and teachers, and seriously handicap the State's Institutions and Departments in discharging their proper functions for the remainder of the fiscal year, and

WHEREAS, there can be no doubt that the ultimate responsibility of solving the State's present financial problems rests with the General Assembly, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the House of Representative, the Senate concurring:

1. That it is the desire of the General Assembly that the Budget Commission rescind its order of April first reducing appropriations for the current year.

2. That in requesting the Budget Commission to rescind the said order, the General Assembly acknowledges and assumes full responsibility for enacting such measures that will preserve a sound financial position in the financial affairs of the State Government.
