My dear Sir

The next day after I wrote you from home I received intelligence of the arrival of the Antares from Antwerp with your furniture, and the next day I came here to make the necessary arrangements, and am happy to say that I am now nearly ready to return to Maryland & again fight with my Dutchmen.

Your things will be sent you as usual the first & before long I hope they will be safely placed to adorn your

drawing room. You will
find that the the mirrors
are all packed in one box
& the frames separate, two
in one box & the third by
itself so you must be
very cautious in opening
& handling box N^o 11.
For you insure the silvering
without great care -

I have much to
say adieu & beg you
to beg & let me have
some more money at
your convenience
