My Dear Uncle,

I have not heard
from you in relation to the boxes -
I am anxious I should write
to you - and has been at me for
two or three days to do so - I was
therefore in compliance with his
request send - the clothes & of the
notes - and Mr Leupp's account
of the freight and charges & on
the furniture - He writes that it is
safely stored away in his warehouse -
where it can remain as long as is
desirable - But I presume will cost
you storage - I have the notes now
before me as I write -

Three notes - each dated April 27th
 1857 - for \$200 - each - at 3, 6, & 9
 mos. respectively — \$600.00
 3. protests - 78¢ each 2.34.
 Duties on furniture 227.70
 Freight & cartage 46
 \$876.04

Interest to be added from 27th Oct
 at least: This I believe to be just
 and right so far as it goes -
 For these you can send your note
 bearing interest or interest added
 in - for such time as you think
 you can pay it in - It will
 close the matter up - all this is
 provided you do not send the
 proceeds - If you do - of course
 deduct the \$300 - and give notes
 for the balance
 Time is better - answer is suffering

from some disease of the stomach
 but is somewhat better - The
 children are home for the holidays -
 Give my love to all - and
 let me hear from you soon
