August 27th 1864

Messrs Jackson Brothers & Co will please say to my sister
Doubt that I am very well. I have had but few letters
from the Home and that the last was dated March and one
previously written dated July 29. We are suffering in this
region from excessive heat and some distress. We have
plenty of every thing that readers can require plenty to eat
and plenty to wear. No news from C. but I hope
he is well. From Mi Cara no news lately had
a letter from W^m H. C. who wrote for the DeLacy, enclosing
a letter from J. who informs us that he had heard the good
and that she was, no more, which information was
glad tidings indeed. Was glad to hear that Uncle Elias
had been so kind and so useful - Saw by the papers that
the Home had been sold for \$10,000. This piece of informa-
tion gave me no pleasure but what can be said.
No doubt it was proper & I acquiesce in the act
of necessity - I proper. Can not say any thing that
will give you a hint of what I will do, but have
with the true confidence hope that we may all meet again
under more favorable auspices -
I will bless you all -
