The meeting was called to order at 2 P.M. by the Chair-
man, Mr. Alan Johnstone, to consider the report of the State Board
of Charities and Corrections concerning applicants for scholarships.

The Secretary of the Board of Charities and Corrections,
Mr. Albert S. Johnstone, appeared before the Board, and explained *minutes*
the method of investigation, and how the Board obtained data other
than that given by the parent or guardian.

Dear Sir:-

As required by law, I herewith hand you the report
of the State Board of Charities and Corrections on the finan-
cial condition of those applicants for beneficiary scholar-
ships in your institution listed by you as eligible. Our
report covers simply the results of our investigation as to
the ability of the applicant, and of such persons as are
liable in law for his support and maintenance, to pay. You
will observe that we have classified your list of eligibles
by counties, arranging them in the order given us by you. On
separate sheets, we have listed these by counties and opposite
each name have written "Pay" or "Ben." Those marked "Pay" are

in our judgment not entitled to beneficiary scholarships under the law; while those marked "Ben" are, so far as we can learn, the deserving cases which the law is intended to aid, provided, of course, they meet the qualifications other than financial inability.

President Riggs suggested that in view of the fact that the Board is required by law to pass upon all applicants for free tuition, that the regular November meeting be postponed until such time in December as the State Board of Charities and Corrections is ready to make its report concerning applicants for free tuition.

The members present stated that they would vote to make the appropriation at the next regular meeting.

President Riggs stated that the Clemson College Hotel had been taken over by the College in accordance with the action of the Board at the July meeting. That he had employed Miss E. C. Porcher at \$35.00 per month as Manager, Mrs. M. B. Rugh at \$20.00 as Assistant

Manager, and would pay Miss Sadler or some ~~one~~ of the stenographers \$5.00 per month for doing the necessary typewriting and clerical work.
